Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



A friend of mine has opened a new record shop. No, not the Wall to Wall Sound, Sam Goody, or Tower Records record shops of days gone by, but a record shop for making records; a record recording studio. Those record shops of the past used to occupy every retail shopping mall in America. It was a requisite store for me to visit as a teen. Friends and I would check out album cover art and listen to a few new tunes using the headphones that were available for that purpose. Occasionally, we even sprung for some new vinyl. I was never really an aficionado when it came to records. My most prized were The Cars, The Romantics, an album by a band that had the word *Sabbath* in its name, whose lead singer apparently bit off the head of a bat, and believe it or not, a recording of The Scots Guards. When my friends were definitely not around, I remember taking The Guards out of its plastic sheath and carefully cleaning the grooves with a special lint



brush. Then, placing it carefully upon the turntable, I would gently place the needle upon it and turn up the volume. Suddenly, I was transported to the Highlands in the land of Loch Ness. I have an eclectic taste in music. What can I say? There was a certain ritual involved in listening to the old 33s and 45s. There was a certain "art" to it, especially for the aficionado for whom a scratched record would cut to the heart. I have scratched just a few records in my day. I've broken a few as well. Let's just say it was anger management, though my cousin would disagree. What has been discovered or, perhaps better, rediscovered in our 21<sup>st</sup> Century, is that "art" of the vinyl record. It does involve a bit of a ritual and a slowing down as well. It is not a matter of swiping through a playlist, but choosing a sound and genre. One might say that there is a greater intentionality in its enjoyment. Vinyl record fans today would also say that there is a far better sound quality over digital. Here I was thinking vinyl records had gone the way of 8 tracks, cassette tapes, and now CDs. In fact, it seemed vinyl led the way into the dustbin of history, but now, I'm told that there is a growing demand. Phil and his business partner, Obie, have invested in and opened "a premiere state-of-the-art custom vinyl pressing facility." The vinyl pressing machines themselves were specially designed and built in Germany. They are of the highest quality and precision. The two investors themselves have years of experience in the professional music industry and quality sound reproductions having worked with many well-known artists



and labels. The new facility is located just south of here along the area of Route 1 heading towards the state line. I'm hoping to maybe visit over the summer, learn a bit about the record making process, and offer a little blessing of the new endeavor as well. It all sounds rather fascinating to me. Sometimes old school is simply better; sometimes one makes progress by taking a step back; sometimes one can win by losing. Vinyl is making a comeback. Aficionados having lost their MP3 device ear buds broke out their turntables and headphones instead. The Music of the Resurrection is as old school as it gets. Jesus Himself, won by losing. If one is willing to become an aficionado and learn the "art" of being a disciple, then the Sound of the Resurrection is as rich, clear, and crisp as it was on that First Easter Sunday.

So sit back and relax! Put on your headphones and enjoy the Music of Resurrection!


Food Pantry Update:
