Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.




SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

I hope that there were still households with children, both young and old, dyeing and decorating some eggs this Easter. I hope also, that the Easter Bunny still made his rounds. I have it on good authority that he was never restricted by any "stay-at-home" order. In fact, I saw him just the other day going down Gramercy Drive! (No, I'm not kidding!) My childhood Easters are memories of colorful Easter baskets filled with assorted candies and always a chocolate bunny. Holy Week, itself, culminated with the dyeing of hard boiled eggs. They didn't last all too long with my father and me devouring them soon after. There are other family Easter traditions that I could mention as well. This Easter more so than others perhaps is a time to highlight family traditions and togetherness with one's immediate family. There is little choice really, since our "stay-at-home" order remains in place and we can't gather together at church this year. All of us hope and pray that we return to some sense of normalcy soon. It begins now, this Easter as we lift any "stay-at-home" order and go out to meet Him starting a whole new family tradition! Just save an egg and chocolate bunny for me!

Remember: Pray for the sick and those that have died. Pray for a containment of the virus. Pray for a vaccine. Turn especially to Our Lady. We know that the Lord can hardly turn down a request made by His Mother!



For the safety of everyone, we are doing a drive-thru in the parking lot directly outside of our Community Center (in back of the school). Do you or your company pay PA state taxes?

Do you or your company pay Pennsylvania state taxes? Why not donate them to Holy Cross School? The application process is easy and we can work hand-in-hand with you to complete it. At Holy Cross, 100% of your donation through EITC and OSTC is used for scholarships for students and tuition assistance for our families to afford a Catholic Education.

Individuals

Individuals can redirect up to 100% of their personal Pennsylvania state income tax bill to Holy Cross. Donors will receive a tax credit for 90% of the EITC or OSTC contribution, which reduces their state income taxes dollar-for-dollar. Further, many individuals will also be able to claim a charitable deduction on their federal tax return for the 10% not included in the tax credit.

Corporations

Corporations are also eligible to receive a 90% Pennsylvania tax credit if they are authorized to do business in Pennsylvania and are subject to one or more of the following taxes:

- Corporate Net Income Tax

- Insurance Premium Tax (excluding surplus lines, unauthorized, domestic/foreign

marine)

- Title Insurance & amp; Trust Company Shares Tax

- Bank and Trust Company Shares Tax
- Capital Stock and Franchise Tax
- Mutual Thrift Tax
- Malt Beverage Tax
- Retaliatory Fees under section 212 of the Insurance Company Law of 1921
- Personal Income Tax of corporation shareholders or
