FROM THE PASTOR

It doesn't seem right, but April is nearly half over. It's been an eventful month so far, with an earthquake and a solar eclipse in the span of a couple days. The day of the earthquake, I had a funeral service shortly after it happened. From a prior service, my funeral ritual book had been set to read the Gospel from the Passion where it talks about darkness covering the land and the veil of the temple being torn in two because of an earthquake. That wasn't eerie at all.... I think we've had enough out-of-the-ordinary natural phenomena for a while now.

Coming up at the end of April we have a special event taking place to support our parish school. Our **Night at the Races** fundraiser is on **Saturday, April 27, at 7:00**. Flyers for this event are available in the vestibules of the church. Besides purchasing a ticket to attend the event, you can also help sponsor it by buying the naming rights to a horse, jockey, or even an entire race. It's a great opportunity to be creative—and maybe have a little fun "honoring" someone. Anyone want to name a horse Nagging Mother-in-law? Just remember we're a Catholic school, so nothing too (ahem) racy please.

Another event worth highlighting isn't happening at Holy Cross but is connected in a way to our parish. On May 3, Cardinal O'Hara High School will have their 10th annual **Danny Hammond Dance Marathon**. Danny Hammond was a parishioner and an alumnus of Holy Cross School. At the age of 9, he was diagnosed with cancer, and fought it bravely for 13 years. Sadly, he lost the battle and died in 2014. The next year, the students of O'Hara began a dance marathon in Danny's honor to raise money to support those battling childhood cancer and to benefit other worthy causes. We have several students from Holy Cross helping to organize and fundraise for this event.

I was recently asked if the parish could assist by being one of the event sponsors for the marathon. How could I say no? I never knew Danny, but asking around among staff and teachers, anyone who did know him says nothing but great things about him—a beautiful witness of endurance of suffering and a compassionate heart for others. If there is an event named after him to continue his legacy, we need to support it as a parish.

Of course, we all know our piggy bank doesn't have too many extra pennies in it. So, let's make this a true show of parish support. If you'd like to make a special contribution to support the Danny Hammond Dance Marathon at Cardinal O'Hara High School in the name of the parish, you can drop off your gift at the parish office or place it in the collection in an envelope marked for this purpose. We signed up as a "silver" sponsor with a commitment of \$750. I'm confident we can raise at least that much. Anything we take in over that will go to the dance marathon as a general contribution. Thank you in advance for your support as we honor the legacy of one of our own.



Reading I: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19

Peter's sermon theme is that the suffering Messiah was raised from the dead. This implies our personal need for repentance and conversion.

Reading II: I John 2: 1-5a

The author connects knowledge of Christ with observance of His commands. This in turn leads to a deep love of God.

The Gospel: Luke 24: 35-38

The main point is not the reality of Jesus' body as much as it is His victory over death by His renewal of the table fellowship with His disciples. Preaching repentance "to all nations" becomes their mission.




