

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia! On behalf of all the clergy and staff here at Holy Cross, I take a moment to wish a Blessed Easter to all! May the Risen Christ fill you all with joy and peace on this most holy of days! This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad! And now, on to some parish business and some reminders...

This Saturday, April 23, from 9:00-3:00 is our Flea Market! We have dozens of vendors lined up. Come out to see what treasures you may find, grab lunch from the snack bar, and help support this parish fundraiser. If you'd like to volunteer to help in any way, please call the office. I'm sure we'll find a way you can help.

As you know, our church building has been suffering from a number of **heating and air conditioning concerns.** We did get the boiler replaced during the winter. We are still working on figuring out how we can regulate the temperature in the church. Right now, staff has to turn different components on and off manually to keep things from getting too hot or too cold. It's not easy, and there's a lot of guesswork involved, which is why some days it's hotter or colder than others. The current pneumatic thermostats and piping are beyond repair, and the company is trying to find a cost-effective and non-destructive solution. (We could simply jack-hammer through a few marble walls to help diagnose the problem and run new pneumatic lines, but I didn't find that an aesthetically pleasing option. I'm sure you'd agree.)

In the meantime, we do have to pay for the boiler and plumbing work that was done (approx. \$79,000) and for what is still to come (still TBD). We have been able to pay these bills out of our savings, but now our piggy bank has gotten pretty low and it's time to try and replenish it.

When we power washed the statues in front of the church, we did a special envelope campaign, which we called "Freshen our Façade." Many of you stepped up admirably to help offset the cost of that project. It's time to ask you to step up again. We're doing another envelope campaign, which we're going to call <u>"Tame our Temp"</u> since the goal is to be able to avoid the extreme temperature swings in the church—and because you need a catchy name for things. Envelopes will be located at the entrances of the church and in your pews. If you can help us offset the cost of these repairs and upgrades, the parish would be most grateful. Donations can be made via the collection or mailed/dropped off to the office. I know everyone's household budget is getting stretched pretty thin and it's not the easiest time to be asking for additional support for the parish, but these projects are going to save us money in the long run and help us have a comfortable space in which to do our most important duty of worshipping God on Sundays. I thank you in advance for your support and generosity.

Quick reminder: another way you can support our parish and school is through the use of the **scrip program**. It's really simple: you buy gift cards through us at face value (via an app or through a paper form). The company gives us a rebate, which we use for tuition assistance. You do your normal shopping, gas purchasing, and dining out; we get a little extra money to support the school. It's a win-win with little effort. Please call Terry Carey in the office for more info.

Thank you as always for your ongoing and faithful support of Holy Cross Parish! We are glad you are here with us today and look forward to seeing you soon. Once again, Happy Easter!
