# FROM THE PASTOR

Last week at the 8:30 Mass, I was impressed by the number of people who were at Mass. It looked like we had 30-40 more people at the Mass than we usually do, many of them young families, and many of them people I don't recall seeing before. So in the hopes that some of the people reading this today are among their number and coming back again this week, welcome back, and we are all glad you're here. Please feel free to say hello, and let Deacon Tom or me know if there is anything we can do to help you feel welcome here at Holy Cross!

We also had some not-so-welcome guests at that Mass. I understand there were some people standing outside panhandling for money. I didn't have a chance to meet them, since as soon as someone suggested they meet with the parish priest, they hopped in their car and disappeared quickly. I don't want to ascribe impure motives to anyone and prejudge someone who might actually be in need, but that's usually a suspicious sign.

The reality is there are a lot of scammers out there. They often run a circuit from church to church looking for handouts. They thrive on hoping to catch you in a hurry and off-guard (like as you're leaving the church and trying to get your car quickly. They hope you won't engage them or ask questions but just toss a few bucks their way so you can get on with your day. As soon as you try to see what they really need or try to get them hooked up with meaningful resources, they bolt to the next stop on their route. It's very sad, because there are plenty of people out there with legitimate needs, and we end up looking at them with suspicion as a result.

Bottom line, please be careful. I'd hate for someone to think he's doing a good deed and end up duped by some unscrupulous fake. If you're ever unsure about someone asking for help, please refer the person to Deacon Tom or me or the parish office, and we will pass the person's information on to our local St. Vincent DePaul Society. They do great work assisting those who need material assistance and ensuring that your charitable support dollars are used appropriately.

A great big thank you to all those who helped put together the flea market on Saturday morning! And thanks to everyone who came out to browse the treasures for sale or grab a bite at the snack bar. Not only are events like this important fundraisers, they are also good opportunities for us to come together as a parish community. We have a few other fun events coming up, so keep those calendars clear and make plans to join us. We need you to help make this parish thrive!




