FROM THE PASTOR

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Happy and Blessed Easter!

A word of thanks is due to all those who have played a role in our liturgical celebrations over the past week. Our choir under the direction of Grete Ingalls always blesses us with the gift of sacred music. A lot of work has to happen behind-the-scenes to set up and clean up pretty quickly for all the special liturgies, and I'm grateful to John Kemmey, Martin McCann, and Zach Maiorano for keeping everything going. Deacon Tom and our altar servers, along with the lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are also invaluable to all the liturgical celebrations. And of course, thanks to all of you, our Holy Cross family, for your participation in the celebrations of Holy Week.

I want to offer a special welcome to all those who are visiting us today, or those who are coming back to this corner of Delco to visit with family for the holiday. We're glad you're here. And a special welcome to those who join us on Easter but perhaps aren't here on other Sundays. We'd love to see you more often.

Given that we do have a larger-than-normal congregation on Easter, this is a good opportunity to talk briefly about parish membership and registration. We routinely receive requests for various letters of reference from the parish. They're needed if someone is asked to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. They may be needed for applications for scholarships for kids or for employment for those looking to work in a Church-related organization. It's happening more and more that such a request comes in, and we find that the person making the request does not appear in our database. That's usually a clear indication that the person is not really a part of parish life and is not coming to Mass regularly. In fairness, it's not possible for us to provide any kind of reference that says the person is. Sometimes people assume they are registered in the parish and are surprised to find out that they are not.

I'd like to encourage everyone to verify that you are actually registered here at Holy Cross so we don't end up in an awkward situation down the road. There's an easy way to check. If you're getting regular mailings of envelopes from us, you're in our database. If you're not getting envelopes (and you haven't told us not to send them since you use e-giving), then odds are we don't have you in our database. If you've realized that this applies to you, please call or e-mail the parish office, and we'll be happy to get you the information you need so we can add you to our records.

Once again, Happy Easter!



Reading I: Acts 10: 34a, 37-43

The Holy Rosary is prayed every weekday morning in the church immediately after the 8:30 Mass. Please join us! Your prayers and suggestions are most welcome.



"Presence: The Mystery of The Eucharist"




