FROM THE PASTOR

Suddenly, August is halfway over. How did that happen?

This weekend, both Fr. Kelly and I are away. Of all the weeks of the summer, we both managed to pick the same weekend to be away. Murphy's Law. I am grateful to Fr. Richard Maisano, Fr. Brandon Artman, and Fr. Jason Buck for covering the Masses during this vacation time, as well as to the other priests who offered to step in and lend a hand.

Reminder: on Monday we celebrate the **Assumption of Our Lady.** There is no obligation to attend Mass this year. While we don't normally have Mass on Mondays, there will be a Mass at 8:30 that morning.

Classes resume in two weeks for the students of our parish school. Our teachers and administrators are getting ready to welcome our children back. I'm hoping that by the time you read this, work will have started on a security upgrade to the school building. We are installing new electronic locks with key fob access, which will allow us to better control who has access to the building and when. We will also be rekeying the manual door locks with upgraded keys. I'm happy we're getting these upgrades to keep our children safer, but it's disturbing that the upgrades are necessary because of all the evil out there. As a consequence of this upgrade, we will be developing new procedures to sign keys out of the parish office for those groups that need school access after-hours and will reach out to those ministries shortly.

Speaking of school safety and security, a quick update on the fence around that school yard that was knocked down during a car accident back in June. Those repairs should be getting started shortly (or may have already started by the time you read this). We had some issues with the insurance company "losing" all the documentation we sent them about the damage. We finally got that settled and are able to go ahead with the repairs, and then had to get on the schedule for the tree cutter and the fence repair company. I know it's been a mess over there, so hopefully it will be good-as-new soon.

Going back to the calendar theme for a moment: we are in the process of creating a new parish calendar and process for reserving space in parish facilities for parish organizations and ministries. The old way of doing things got to be a little unwieldy and there was a risk of double booking and not really knowing what is going on in our buildings. Going forward, all events and activities that happen in parish space will be booked on a master calendar. If you are part of a parish group that uses parish facilities, please contact me or Terry Carey in the parish office to let us know your requests for space. This new protocol will also make it easier for us to publish a calendar on our website and on other media, which will also better show off all the good things we are doing as a parish.

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time
