Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



Mark your calendars! We will be celebrating our Parish Feast Day the weekend of September 11 and 12. Masses Saturday Evening and Sunday will be for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and the Social Committee and Knights of Columbus are planning a celebration to take place after the Masses. More information will follow, but it will be great to celebrate our parish. Another calendar item of note for the parish is that the date for my installation as pastor has been set. We will be honored to welcome Bishop McIntyre for the Rite of Installation on Sunday, October 3, at 11:00 a.m. Given how time is flying, these events will be here before we know it.

I'm sure many of us have been keeping an eye on the headlines surrounding the pandemic. We will continue to follow whatever guidelines are issued by the Archdiocese for the celebration of Mass and sacraments, as well as the operation of the school and PREP. The past 18 months have taught us to stay on our toes and be prepared for a change of plans at a moment's notice. I have to say I feel especially sorry for the many young people who had been planning weddings during this time; some of them have had to reschedule multiple times. Planning a wedding is stressful enough, but how do you tell Aunt Edna she may or may not be welcome depending on potential capacity restrictions?

In the meantime, please be prudent and exercise appropriate care when coming to the church. I would also ask that, in a spirit of charity and good-will, we all be respectful of one another and the choices and decisions each of us makes in response to the current and any forthcoming guidance that may be out there.

One of the challenges that the pandemic has brought to light is the need for quick and effective communication. Our traditional means of communication have significant lead times. The parish bulletin goes to press several days before you get it. Mass mailings take days to weeks for printing, stuffing, and mailing—and they're expensive!

On the other hand, electronic communications can be sent pretty quickly and reliably. There are systems out there that will allow us to send e-mails and/or text messages to the parish for more instant communication. I think it's time for us to leverage what technology can offer us. The office staff and I will be looking at some options in the near future and seeing what is available and how we can best serve the parish with them. Expect to see more information here soon, along with an invitation to sign up for whatever service we go with.

A final note for this week: you'll notice in the vestibule there are posters looking for new choir members. We have one of the largest choir lofts I've seen in this church, and it would be wonderful to have a few more people filling up that space. If you're interested in sharing your vocal talents beyond the four walls of your shower, now's your chance. Please let Grete know and I'm sure she'll be happy to welcome you.

Statement of Archbishop Nelson Perez regarding The Obligation to Attend Sunday Mass

"We have all felt the impact of COVID-19 in as individuals and families. It has been a time of acute hardship and struggle, of separation and isolation. Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, has been with us throughout this challenging period and is most especially near to us when we encounter him in the Eucharist. The Eucharist offers us His healing and peace, His mercy and reconciliation. It is now time for everyone to return to the Eucharist with renewed faith and joy.

As many aspects of life are now returning to normalcy, each Catholic Bishop in Pennsylvania will reinstate the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days beginning on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.


