FROM THE PASTOR

A few decades ago, the pastor of one of our archdiocesan parishes was leaving for a vacation. As he left, he gave the contact information for where he'd be to his new, young assistant and said "don't call me unless the church is on fire." Sure enough, a few days later, a candle was left burning too close to something flammable, and that new priest had to call the pastor and tell him that the church was indeed on fire. So much for that pastor's vacation!

Fortunately here, we didn't experience anything nearly so drastic while I was away. (I think Fr. Collins was praying especially hard for that!) The heavy rains from Tropical Storm Debby did have an impact though. They did a nice job exposing the leaks we have in the rooves of some of our buildings. And we had a few downed tree branches, including a rather large chunk of a tree right on the property line in the parking lot that had to be removed by a professional arborist. Fortunately, it doesn't appear that anything was damaged.

We are continuing to work on assessing our buildings and grounds to see where work may be needed in the future. A couple weeks ago, an engineer who works for the archdiocese visited Holy Cross to look at our buildings. He's in the process of putting together a full report of what he noticed, which will help identify any immediate concerns and give us an idea of what to expect and for what we should plan. Some things are relatively minor. For example, the hot water heater in one of our buildings is getting kind of old and ought to be replaced in the next year or two. Easy enough. Others...not so much. For example, the steps in front of the church will eventually need attention, which would probably carry a six-figure price tag. Gulp! When I get the final report, I'll share some highlights in a future column.

I mentioned a few weeks ago that we received a grant for the school to upgrade the security camera system. That grant is still being held up in bureaucratic red tape, so we haven't been able to get started on the project yet, so it'll probably be something that happens during the school year. Meanwhile, we also found out about a grant available to churches to finance safety and security projects, and we are in the process of applying for that as well. Say a prayer that we are selected as a recipient of some of those funds.

CAN YOU NOT SPEND 1 HOUR WITH ME??



The Eucharistic miracles Lanciano in Italy occurred in the 8th century. A certain priest developed doubts about Christ's presence in Eucharist. One day after consecration, during Mass, the wine and bread visibly turned into blood and flesh. This was preserved through the centuries. In 1970-71 and in 1981, scientist Odoardo Linoli, a professor of pathological histology, clinical microscopy and chemistry as well as anatomy, investigated the miracle.

The professor came to the conclusion that the flesh was cardiac tissue containing veins, nerve fibers and arterioles. The blood type matched with the blood type of other Eucharistic miracles, namely AB. The WHO too verified the finding of the Italian doctors, and after 500 examinations expressed the inability of science to explain Eucharistic miracles Lanciano.
