FROM THE PASTOR

Finally! If you've gone out the far driveway onto Springfield Road (the one furthest from the rectory) in the last year or so, you probably noticed that the storm drain on Springfield Road was collapsing. If you didn't go over it just right as you turned onto Springfield, it sure felt like you might end up leaving part of your undercarriage on the curb. I don't even remember when we first reported the problem to the Township and then to PennDOT (it's a state road), but I feel like it's been nearly a year. Shortly after we reported it, someone came out and put a traffic cone over the area—not exactly a permanent fix. After a few months of follow-up that got nowhere, I'd given up hope that anything would happen beyond that cone—which also disappeared after a few days.

Last week, we suddenly had a bunch of bright yellow PennDOT trucks on and around the campus. Nobody told us anything was going to happen, but it appears they are actually fixing that storm drain. At least, I hope that's what's going on. As of when I'm writing this, they're still working on it. Let's hope whatever fix they have done works and that we can all have smooth sailing out of that far exit!

This past Tuesday, our school families, faculty, and staff gathered for a night of "Popsicles in the Park." It was an opportunity for all to gather informally, have a frozen treat, meet one another, and catch up with friends. Judging by the attendance, I'd say it was a great success. I want to thank Mr. Salvatore for coming up with the idea, and especially thank Mrs. Spurrier and Miss Sheila for setting it all up and handling popsicle duty. Also, an apology to anyone who was looking to buy popsicles at the Acme on Tuesday afternoon only to find empty shelves; I think our dynamic duo bought every box the store had!

Finally for this week, another reminder about being aware of scams and fraud attempts. At a meeting this past week, we were discussing a new scam where fraudsters will modify ads for legitimate fundraising events and put their contact info in place of the legit info. For example, a group might have a spaghetti dinner, and everyone should contact Mrs. Smith for tickets. A fraudster starts to put out posts on social media advertising the dinner and saying to contact Mr. Jones for tickets. The victim sees the fake ad and contacts Mr. Jones, who then gets the payment by Venmo, Zelle, or whatever other app is out there right now—or maybe even gets a check mailed to him somehow. Victim shows up at spaghetti dinner expecting to be on the list and to have a ticket waiting, only to find out that Mrs. Smith has no idea who he is. Mr. Jones has made a bunch of money that should have gone to the charity. Awful. So, please be careful. We have a number of events coming up here at Holy Cross. If you're unsure if you're buying tickets from someone authorized to sell them, you can call the office to be sure.
