Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



The other day I was in one of the stores and noticed that the Fall/Halloween decorations were starting to hit the shelves, taking the place of the notebooks and highlighters and other school supplies in the seasonal section. That's a sign that families are stocking up on their supplies and essentials, and the stores are getting ready for the next season. Ready or not, we're in full back-to-school mode. The parish school begins classes this week on a modified schedule, and the public schools are opening soon.

With the return of school comes an important reminder of the return to Religious Education as well. PREP will be resuming in two weeks here at the parish, which begs an important question. Parents, have you registered your children yet? Every parish I have been assigned to sees the same challenge of many last-minute registrations. It's understandable. At the start of Summer it's easy to say "oh yeah, I have lots of time to get that done." And then life happens and other things come up and before you know it, PREP starts in a week and you're in a panic because you never sent the re-registration materials. (I have something similar happen the month my car needs to be inspected: on the first I have plenty of time and it can wait, by the 15<sup>th</sup> I forget, and on the 30<sup>th</sup> I'm calling every garage and dealership in town to see who can squeeze me in.)

Nonetheless, our PREP staff has a lot of work to do to plan the year ahead in assigning classrooms and ordering books and supplies. So a gentle reminder that if you haven't submitted your registration, please do so. And if you're reading this as a grandparent or aunt/uncle of a PREP student and know that Mom and Dad aren't going to be reading this, perhaps you could pass on the reminder. If you have questions or need more information about PREP, please contact Mrs. Meliti.

By the way, remember that religious education doesn't have to (shouldn't) stop once you're done with school. Adults are welcome to join our upcoming Bible Study series on the Gospel of John. Of the four Gospels, St. John's stands out for its depth and intensity. It's worth taking the time to study. More information about the study series can be found elsewhere in the bulletin. But if you're interested, please don't hesitate, as the series starts next week.

As many aspects of life are now returning to normalcy, each Catholic Bishop in Pennsylvania will reinstate the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days beginning on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This is a moment to thank God anew for the great gift of the Mass and the Real Presence of Jesus to us in his Holy Body and Blood as wells as the joy of gathering together as people of faith."
