

SUNDAY, AUGUST 6, 2023



FROM THE PASTOR

Today our normal cycle of Sundays in Ordinary Time is disrupted by our celebration of the Transfiguration of the Lord, which is celebrated each year on August 6. We always read about the Transfiguration on the Second Sunday of Lent, but we have an actual celebration of this historical event on the Church calendar to celebrate each year (just like we have an annual celebration of Christmas and the Assumption of the Blessed Mother, etc.).

We don't actually know when the actual Transfiguration event occurred. Some scholars suggest it happened around the time of the Jewish Feast of Tabernacles, which would put it in September or October, at harvest time. Others believe the Transfiguration may have happened in the Spring, close to Good Friday, to firm up the faith of the Apostles as they got ready for what was to come.

One might then wonder why we celebrate the Transfiguration on August 6—since that doesn't really fall into either of the two most commonly argued timeframes above. Back in the centuries when the Church calendar wasn't as centralized as it is today and there was considerable local variation, it seems this particular feast was celebrated at different times in different places, with August 6 being a fairly common date.

August 6 happens to be the 40th day before the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14, which may be why this date was so prevalent—we like the number 40 in the Church after all, and it seems fitting to link these two celebrations together that way. In the mid-15th century, after a military victory against invading Turkish forces in Eastern Europe on August 6, the pope made it official that the Transfiguration would be celebrated on August 6 across the board.

So just in case you were wondering why the priest and deacon were in white today and why we were hearing a Gospel reading that we heard back during Lent, now you know.

I will be away on a much-needed vacation this week. I am most grateful to the various priests who have agreed to celebrate Mass and hear confessions here while I'm gone. As the number of priests continues to decline, finding priests to cover Masses so one can take a vacation gets to be more and more of a challenge. Pray for more vocations to the priesthood!

Transfiguration of the Lord



Reading I: Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14

The celestial court convenes before the "Ancient One". Then the Son of Man (Jesus) is given full dominion over the universe.

Reading II: 2 Peter 1: 16-19

Peter offers his experience of the Transfiguration, Jesus in full glory along with the divine proclamation: "This is my beloved Son."

The Gospel: Matthew 17: 1-9

Jesus becomes a being of light, luminous and transparent. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets respectively.


