FROM THE PASTOR


Last year, the choir wanted to do an evening of lessons and carols as a way of celebrating Advent and preparing for Christmas. So we added it to the calendar. Given that it was the first year doing it and there was some possible overlap with a football game, we really had no idea how many people to expect. In my mind, I thought we might have fifteen; we might have fifty. So, when 150 people showed up, I was beyond stunned. It was a truly wonderful evening. The choir members worked really hard, and being able to sit back and relax and listen to a combination of favorite Christmas carols and some unique and unfamiliar pieces interspersed with readings from scripture was very much needed. This month can be busy, and times to relax and savor the season can be sparse.

I say all that because **the second annual lessons and carols concert is this weekend.** If you're not doing anything at **4:00 on Sunday**, come on back to the church and enjoy the music and readings. If you have other plans, cancel them and come here instead. I'm sure you'll be glad you did.

A quick reminder for anyone looking for ideas for Christmas gifts: we still have some Holy Cross 75th anniversary merchandise for sale. A Christmas ornament or magnet might be a unique gift for someone. You can call the office or visit our website for more information.

Also, a reminder in case you're cleaning out your closet to make room for the new sweaters and clothes you'll get at Christmas: we're collecting old clothing in the green bins near the gym. The company that owns the bins and collects the clothing pays us for participating in the program, and the more we fill the bins, the better. Other proceeds from the clothing donations are used for charitable purposes as well. So if last year's ugly sweater is too ugly to wear again, toss it into the green bin and help our parish at the same time.

Lastly this week, just a reminder about extra opportunities for Confession this Advent. We have confessions Thursday mornings during Advent at 7:00 am, and we'll have an evening opportunity on Monday, the 18th at 7:00 pm.



Reading I: Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11

In the prophet's vision, The Lord addresses a heavenly assembly that includes himself. Someone speaks up and says that the Lord will soon lead a new exodus through the desert.

Reading II: 2 Peter 3: 8-14

The author addresses any cynics who scoff at God's seeming delay in coming. This time actually allows for necessary repentance. Still, the day of His coming remains unknowable.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 1-8th

Mark relates the promise of the Old Testament prophets to John the Baptist, and also to his divine Cousin Jesus who actually is "the One to come," the Messiah.
