Sometimes it's good to be reminded of God's Providence at work. For a while now, just about everyone on the parish staff has been dealing with issues with their computers. They were old, slowing down, and getting to the point of being unreliable—the computers, not the staff! The server that houses the parish database was well beyond its life-expectancy, and our tech support company had been suggesting for a while that we needed to address that. Clearly, we needed some upgrades. Of course, it's easy to say what we need to do. Figuring out how to pay for what we need to do is a bigger challenge.

Not too long after we started to discuss this situation and try to decide how to proceed, we received a generous gift from the estate of a recently-deceased parishioner. That unexpected gift gave us some money to move ahead with the tech upgrades. Terry and I met with our tech support company to see what they recommended and then looked into what things would cost. The amount of that bequest turned out to be about half of what we would need—which meant we could at least upgrade the most critical machines.

And then Black Friday rolled around. Lo and behold, the computers we were looking at happened to be on a great sale. I did the math, and with the sale price, we had enough from the bequest that we could upgrade all the computers at once. Even better, they were in stock for quick delivery—a miracle unto itself it seems these days. Sold! As I'm writing this, the tech company is in the process of installing everything, and we should be in good shape with our office tech for several years. I am grateful to the deceased parishioner and the family for their generous gift to the parish, and I thank God that He had it all worked out somehow that we'd get this gift, and that it would end up being enough to meet our needs. It's not quite the loaves and fishes miracle, but God did take that bequest and multiply it enough to meet our needs and then some.

Speaking of gifts, with two weeks to go until Christmas, it's time for another reminder about the **Scrip program**. If you're giving gift cards to anyone, please consider purchasing them through us. We get a rebate from the stores, which we use for school tuition assistance. It's an easy way to support Holy Cross. Please call Terry in the office for additional details.


Singers & Musicians
