

It was very early on a chilly morning in the days near Christmas. I was returning to my parish having enjoyed a most restful day off. It seemed especially dark that particular morning well before sunrise. A back road travelled was most familiar. The car could just about drive it by itself. Rounding a curve, I began a rather steep descent in a wooded area. No one else was on the road at that hour. I was lost in my thoughts thinking about the Mass that I would be celebrating in a little while and the homily that I would give. Looking ahead, the headlights began to catch a glimpse of something. I strained my eyes staring into the darkness. It appeared that there was something on the road. There was definitely something on the road. The headlights began to give greater clarity. Something quite big and quite yellow was lying across the road! Everything after this point began to happen in mere milliseconds. A school bus had flipped and was blocking the road! Oh, my God! There were no flashing lights of any kind. It must have just happened. I thought of the driver. I thought of the children. I would have to render assistance. I began to sweat and I began to brake. It was then that I also began to pray. The brakes had no effect. I was on black ice. There had been some rain the previous day coupled with higher temperatures and the bit of early snow on the ground had mostly melted. Water runoff always cascaded down this winding road at certain points and ordinarily wouldn't pose a problem. That morning I hadn't realized that the temperature had once again dropped to just below freezing. Runoff water had now literally become a sheet of ice. As I sped down the hill with brakes that didn't hold and ever closer to the overturned bus, I noticed something. There was a small gap between the school bus and the right edge of the road. Off the road's edge, there was a rather large tree stump with an embankment that dropped off into the woods. I wondered which I would rather strike. Tree stumps deeply rooted generally don't give way and beyond that stump were more deeply rooted trees that also wouldn't give way. I might have better luck with the big yellow box that was the bus. Well, I thought, let me at least try "threading the needle," while attempting to skirt closer to the bus that might be a tad "softer." I held the wheel tightly with my sweaty hands. Fortunately, my little SUV had a safety feature that sensed wheel slippage and made torque correction automatically. I think that helped me to maintain a bit of control. I said, "Lord, You're going to have to help me here" and then I said, "My Jesus, Mercy." I braced for impact as I sped past the bus in a flash. In my mind it was like slow motion. A figure stood off to the side of the road in the darkness. It was the school bus driver I presumed – or perhaps my guardian angel. Thank God that there were no children to be seen. It was too early. The bus with its driver was en route to young charges not yet out of bed. There was no impact. The needle had been threaded, but I wasn't able to regain the ability to brake for several hundred yards down that incline. There was no going back. I wouldn't be able to climb the hill on the ice. I thanked God while praying for the bus driver and continued on my way arriving safely at the parish for Mass. It would truly be a Mass of Thanksgiving. Advent is certainly not a time of fright, but rather one of joy. However, the rush of the season can sometimes be as that day of sliding on black ice. Impact can appear imminent as things seemingly get out of our control with the decorating, shopping and deadlines. Then, there is the New Year so soon to arrive with taxes that are due and a pandemic ongoing. And let's not even mention things political! It is important to hold the wheel steady and pray! With our own prayer and that of others for us, we're able to "thread the needle" and soon enough we will arrive at Bethlehem where a Savior is born very early in the darkest hours that give way to a whole New Day filled with brilliant sunlight! It is that Day for which we now so long! Safe travels! Come, O Come, Emmanuel!


