FROM THE PASTOR

Last Sunday's service of Lessons and Carols was a beautiful and inspiring event enjoyed by all in attendance. Thank you to the dedicated men and women of our parish choir (and the instrumentalists who accompanied them) for sharing their musical talents to give us a holy reminder of the meaning of Christmas. I am also grateful to the Knights of Columbus for sponsoring and coordinating the refreshments afterward, and to all those who brought desserts to share. If you didn't make it this year, you missed out!

The long-awaited engineering study on the façade of our school building has been completed. As I'm writing this, we'd just gotten it, so it's going to take some time to digest. Glancing through it, I was really hoping to see the phrase "it's not as bad as we initially thought" jump out at me, but unfortunately that phrase is nowhere to be seen in the report. It does look like extensive repairs are needed around the entire building as there is a lot of deterioration and damage.

So, now that we have this report, and the report from the overall facilities assessment done during the Summer, I'm going to schedule a meeting with officials from the Archdiocese to discuss next steps and where we go from here. As I get more information, I'll be sharing with everyone here in the bulletin.

Don't forget next Sunday we will be decorating the church for Christmas after the 11:00 Mass. Volunteers are needed to help set up the Nativity and all the Christmas trees.

The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle.

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.


