

This week, an update on where we are with our various heating and air conditioning projects in the church. First, we are assessing the pneumatic thermostat controls to see what needs to be done to fix them. This has required the purchase of an air compressor and dryer, which were recently delivered. A technician will be onsite for a few days to install the parts, check where there are problems, and make recommendations for needed repairs. There is a lot of unknown with this, but it will be nice when we don't have to wonder if it'll be 55 or 80 when we come to Mass. The second project is the replacement of one of the boilers and its gas burner. God has been good to us with this project. We found a company that offered us a competitive price and had the boiler and burner in stock! Other companies were saying it could be 3-4 months before they could source one. Thank you, Divine Providence! We accepted the bid, and they started working within a few days. The old boiler has been removed, and the new one is in the process of being installed. The third project is the replacement of a number of large valves that control the flow of water in the pipes around the boilers. These valves, some of which are the size of a steering wheel, allow us to isolate areas of the system for service or repair. The current valves were corroded and rusted, and some were leaking. The screw snapped in one of them as the installer was turning the handle while replacing it. Needless to say, it was time to replace them. Just for fun, while all these things are going on, one of the circulating pumps failed as well and had to be replaced. Why not, right?

While all this is going on, we may find ourselves with big temperature swings in the church for a while yet. I appreciate your patience and understanding. We are working to get things fixed, but it does take time. To be honest, I'm amazed at how quickly things are happening. And in case you're wondering, here's a picture of the decay in the old boiler and the deterioration of one of the valves that had to be replaced. You can see why these projects are necessary!

Finally, on behalf of Fr. Kelly, our deacons, and the parish and school staff, MERRY CHRISTMAS to all! Safe travels for those who are going away, and for those who are staying, see you in church!

TAX SAVINGS FOR YOU / GIFT TO HOLY CROSS

If you are age 70 ½ or older, the best way to make a charitable contribution can be through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from a traditional IRA. A QCD can satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year and reduce your income taxes.

The tax benefit of giving from and IRA is greater than writing a check and taking a tax-deduction. Such gifts are also wellsuited if you are subject to the RMD, but no longer itemize deductions for income tax purposes.

Suppose your RMD for the year is \$10,000-. Make at least \$10,000 of QCDs and you have satisfied your RMD and avoided income tax on the distribution. The money is out of your tradi-

tional IRA, but there is no gross income on your tax return. For a charitable distribution from and IRA to qualify as a QCD, the contribution must be made directly from the IRA custodian or trustee to the charity.
