- If you're a student enjoying the time between semesters, I hope you have a restful break. They don't seem to last nearly long enough.
- If you're a former parishioner who moved away and have come home to visit the family for the holidays, welcome home! I hope you have a wonderful visit, and hopefully we'll see you on your next trip.
- If you're here visiting friends or family, welcome to Holy Cross! Thank you for being with us today. You are always welcome anytime you're in town.
- If you're new to the area and coming to our church for the first time, welcome! Feel free to say
 hi after Mass and introduce yourself. I'll admit I'm not the best at remembering names, but it
 will still be nice to meet you.
- And finally...if you're someone who is a Holy Cross parishioner but maybe aren't here all that
 often, the rest of this column is for you! Please read on. Of course, everyone else is welcome to
 read what follows as well.

There is NO guilt trip here. Everyone has reasons to be here, and everyone has reasons for staying away. You have yours. Life is really busy. I work hard all week and want a day to relax. Mass is boring. My work/golf/football-watching schedule doesn't align with the Mass schedule. The music is lousy. The kids are involved in so many activities and sports that we just don't have time. I can pray to God on my own. My health isn't all that great, and it's hard to get out of the house. The homilies are too long. I'm angry at the Church or the parish because [person] did [something horrible]. I don't agree with what the Church teaches about [moral issue]. I'm confused from when they changed all the words, and I can barely say the word consubstantial, let alone understand what the heck it means. I'm angry at God because [point of suffering]. I don't really know what I believe, or even if I believe. I just kind of have fallen out of the habit. I did something wrong years ago, and I'm embarrassed or afraid to show my face in church.

Whatever your personal reason, I can't write anything here that would adequately address it. What I can do is ask and invite. What's your reason? How can we as a parish, or how can I as the pastor, help you through it? Let me know. Call me in the new year, and let's talk. Or send an e-mail to the parish. Seriously, I want to know what we can do. What I can do.

This year we celebrated 75 years as a parish. I want us to be here for another seventy-five and beyond. And I want to do what I can to ensure you are part of that journey to our sesquicentennial. (That means 150th anniversary. Oh, and consubstantial is a philosophical word to mean "of the same substance." That part of the creed was written in response to a heresy saying the Son was created and thus fundamentally different in essence from the Father. The response was no, He's of the same substance and thus equal to the Father in divinity—hence, consubstantial.)

On behalf of Deacon Tom and the parish staff, Merry Christmas to all! May God bless you abundantly in this holy time of year.





PATRISTICS 101

Apostolic and Ante-Nicene Fathers

THURSDAYS, JANUARY - JUNE 2024

■ LIVE ONLINE COURSE

In this course on the Fathers of the Church, we shall delve deeply into the writings of the first Christian centuries (up to the Council of Nicaea in 325) and become acquainted with such figures as St. Clement of Rome, St. Ignatius, St. Justin Martyr, St. Irenaeus, Tertullian, St. Cyprian, and Origen, and come to an appreciation of their specific genius and their legacy for our own generation. We shall also devote some time to the principles of the theological discipline of Patristics, which in turn will shed light on the usefulness of the Fathers in our own theological reflection.



John Pepino, Ph.D.



Dr. John Pepino is a professor of Greek, Latin, History, and Patristics at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, Nebraska. His Master's degree is in Classical Greek and Latin and his Doctorate is in the Fathers of the Church. He has published on the Fathers of Church

and on contemporary Church History (particularly Vatican II and the liturgy in the twentieth century) in both scholarly and popular outlets.
