Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



Some years ago, there was a series of commercials for one of the cell phone companies featuring a man going around asking "can you hear me now?" as he was testing where he had a signal on his phone. I think the commercials have ended, but the phrase has sort of persevered as an enduring common phrase. Now, when it comes to our church building, I know the answer to that question is usually "no" or "not really" or "not too well." I've started speaking with a company that has a good track record of helping churches improve their sound quality to get some ideas for what we can do here at Holy Cross. The good news is there are some things we can try that should help. The bad news is the recurring theme of 2021: supply chain issues, product availability challenges, and exponential price increases. The situation with the church boiler has also become a bigger priority, so we're going to have to wait a bit to look at this project in great detail, but we are at least getting some ideas.

We're also looking to start setting aside the funds to help pay for the future upgrades. After discussing with the fundraising committee, we've decided that money raised in the parish calendar sale this year will be saved and used for sound system upgrades when we are ready to go forward with that project. Calendars are on sale after Mass the next few weekends, and volunteers at the church exits will be happy to provide you with more information on how the calendar works. As always, thank you for your support!

At the risk of talking too much about money and finances in one column, I did want to make another plug for our revitalized scrip program. You can use scrip to purchase e-gift cards, which can be stored in an app on your phone or printed off to give as gifts. When you're thinking about shopping for Christmas gifts (and your routine household shopping), think about using scrip to help the parish. Just the other day I had to make an online purchase for some equipment for the parish. Once I knew the total, I went to the scrip website, bought an e-gift card to that store, and within seconds used it to pay for my stuff. A few extra clicks and made a few dollars for the parish. Easy money! Once you get into the habit, a little effort can go a long way toward helping the parish and the school. For more information, please contact Terry Carey in the office.

I always feel like Advent is a neglected season in the life of the Church. It's only four weeks, the last of which is usually shortened depending on what day of the week Christmas is. The secular world has been decorated for and celebrating Christmas since the last trick-or-treater took the final Snickers bar. And there are so many things going on that it's hard to really focus on the season or maintain a spiritual focus. I mentioned last week that Holy Cross now has a subscription to FORMED – a treasury of Catholic videos, bible studies, e-books, podcasts, and more. If you sign up for Formed, you'll see they have a whole series of Advent-related videos and talks (including some cartoons for kids), along with the opportunity to sign up to have a daily reflection sent to your inbox. It's a good opportunity to honor the season at times and in places that are convenient for you.

TAX SAVINGS FOR YOU / GIFT TO HOLY CROSS

If you are age 70 ½ or older, the best way to make a charitable contribution can be through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from a traditional IRA. A QCD can satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year and reduce your income taxes.

The tax benefit of giving from and IRA is greater than writing a check and taking a tax-deduction. Such gifts are also wellsuited if you are subject to the RMD, but no longer itemize deductions for income tax purposes.

Suppose your RMD for the year is \$10,000-. Make at least \$10,000 of QCDs and you have satisfied your RMD and avoided income tax on the distribution. The money is out of your tradi-

tional IRA, but there is no gross income on your tax return. For a charitable distribution from and IRA to qualify as a QCD, the contribution must be made directly from the IRA custodian or trustee to the charity.


