FROM THE PASTOR

The choir has been working hard preparing for this year's **Lessons and Carols** program. The program is this weekend, Sunday evening at 4:00 p.m. It promises to be an evening of beautiful music and a time to reflect on the sacredness of this season. And some refreshments afterward make for a nice bonus. Please plan to attend!

Monday is the holy day that wasn't, but now is, but kind of isn't. (For a full explanation of what I mean, see the column from two weeks ago.) There will be Mass for the feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Monday, December 9, at 8:30 am. Due to the confusion surrounding this holy day this year, Roman Catholics in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia are not required to attend Mass. Still, I hope you'll attend Monday morning if you are able.

A quick reminder that during Advent, there are additional times for the **Sacrament of Penance** on Thursday mornings (December 12 and 19) from 7:00-8:00 and on Monday, December 16, from 7:00-8:00pm. Please take advantage of the opportunity.

Two weeks from now, we'll be decorating the church for Christmas—setting up the Christmas trees and the big Nativity scene in the sanctuary. If you can stick around (or come back) after the 11:00 Mass on the 22nd, I'm sure we could use the help.

2nd Sunday of Advent

Reading I: Baruch 5: 1-9

The setting here is the ceremony whereby Jerusalem mourns her lost children while in exile. The speaker offers hope and comfort because they are still the Lord's people. He will lead them in joy out of their captivity.

Reading II: Philippians 1: 4-6, 8-11

The community has a share in the joy of the gospel through their conversion, and their support of the Apostle. They have good standing with the Lord that comes through Christ.

The Gospel: Luke 3: 1-6

The story of the beginning of John the Baptist's ministry as prophet opens with a list of the major rulers at the time. St. Luke uses this to illustrate that John's announcement of the Messiah will have worldwide impact.



The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle.

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.


3rd Annual
