

Nirvana and its late lead singer, Kurt Cobain, were the iconic face of the grunge movement and sound of the Nineties. For me, nirvana wasn't some state that I hoped to achieve, but a music to which I often listened in the midst of discernment of direction and vocation in my life. Flannel shirts untucked and baggy, ripped jeans together with unkempt hair on head and face, spoke to a search for meaning in a world in which meaning and purpose were quickly evaporating for many. Grunge, itself, wasn't so much a matter of a searching for and seeking a meaning for life, but rather, a despondent and disdainful response of "who cares?" Perhaps, the tragic end of the famed singer's life only serves to highlight this. I remember reading somewhere that Cobain thought it an exercise of futility for those who sought the meaning behind his songs. The words didn't really mean anything and were just strung together to melody, but people, nonetheless, listened, danced, and sought meaning where there wasn't any. A type of nirvana, I suppose. Though the singer himself apparently sang songs without meaning, for those who listened, the meaning was in the song itself. A refrain repeated and a melody hummed gave meaning and motivation. Jesus, too, sang a song, but His was rich in meaning. It still is and in the season of Advent, all of us are encouraged to listen to it anew. Interestingly, the Savior born in Bethlehem would also come to die a tragic death and He certainly would not be distinguished in His dress of tunic and sandals. I suppose that even the hair on His head and face were more unkempt than not, given that there was no Norelco, Gillette, or Barbasol in His day. Jesus, however, didn't declare a life meaningless, but quite the opposite. In fact, it was He, Who gave life its meaning, because it was He, Who gave meaning Life. Purpose comes with being and being comes with Life. Jesus is its Source and thus, Meaning. In some unbelievably strange way (known but to God!), it was a grunge band of the Nineties and some ripped jeans and flannels that helped a future hoodie-wearing priest come to understand this. Here's hoping that as we begin this most beautiful season of Advent with its many well-known songs, melodies, and hymns, you might understand as well!

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

REFLECTION BY REV. LEONDARD N. PETERSON

There is something forlorn about Halloween decorations still hanging around in December. We look at such a place and can only wonder if the owner left town hurriedly. Or that he or she turned seriously ill, and may be lying in a hospital somewhere. Or perhaps the owner is just lazy

and out of touch. For sure, their once proud décor is not in the spirit of the season.

That last instance is precisely what the Church looks like every Advent, when she directs the priest to wear purple, and use the same color for the sanctuary adornment. Then there is the recommended absence of flowers. "What is going on?" we might ask, as we see the rest of the world is festooned with red and green, and is "jingle belling" itself into a shopping spree and a partying marathon?

The simple answer is that the Church believes in a period of penance and fasting before the feast. Those are too ancient and time-tested ways to get ready for a major religious celebration. The people of Italian descent among us try to do the same with their "Feast of the Seven Fishes" but it strikes me that they have waited too long and try to condense a whole month of prep into one evening of December 24.

Obviously, as a Church founded by a Person Who was from childhood a "Sign of Contradiction," she will reflect the Founder in her liturgy and customs. We Catholics are more and more conscious of the conflict we have with our present society when we see so many former aberrations that have been adopted and labeled "the new normal." Just think of the crazy things our legislators have done in the matter of public restrooms.

During these early weeks of Advent, the Church asks us to think forward and consider the Second Coming of Christ. That is when this world as we know it will come to an end and then each of us will be judged. Judged on how much we loved God and neighbor. This is a serious matter because it involves our eternal future. Eternity, they have told me, is a very long time!

Let's face it. We would rather not think about such things. We'd rather turn our attention instead to cozy thoughts of the Babe in the manger. Those many artists employed by the Christmas card makers have given us the bluish moonlight shining on a Nativity scene. Or, that inviting den with a fire glowing and stockings hung on the mantle. Sometimes a cute kitten playing with ribbon gets added. "So nice!" we think.

But Advent doesn't leave us alone with our sweet reveries. It shakes our shoulders and says: "Wake up Christian! Don't you realize that this place isn't your real home and that someday you'll have to leave here to go there? So you better watch out and you better not pout because He's coming to town. I mean Jesus, of course. There's a Second Coming of Christ and you'd better live rightly and justly." As you celebrate the anniversary of the First Coming, which is a fine thing to do because it reminds us of God's great love for us, just keep in mind that Second One!
