Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



A few years ago, a man came to the rectory first thing in the morning. He said he lived a couple streets over and had fallen on hard times and needed some help. The pastor met with him, and a few minutes later the gentleman left with an envelope in hand, courtesy of the good people of the parish and their generous support of the poor box. As it turns out, I went that day to visit a friend for lunch at another parish around 40 minutes away. While I was there, the same man shows up at the rectory to ask the parish for some financial assistance? He told the same story: lived a couple streets over and fell on some hard times and needed some help. I guess he managed to move in the five hours since I saw him? Of course, in spinning his yarn, he conveniently left out the check he got from my parish. Suffice it to say, he didn't walk out of that rectory with an envelope, and he didn't seem too happy that he got caught in his lie.

But it gets better. A few months later, I'd been transferred. One morning, guess who comes knocking on the door? Yep. He must've moved again, because he yet again was living a few streets over from the church, and lo and behold, the exact same misfortune befell him. Amazing. I guess he spent his days going from church to church, telling stories to get free money. Getting caught certainly didn't stop him.

That same year, we had a family that would show up periodically and stand outside the church door with a sign saying they needed money for food and rent. Any time a priest or deacon approached them, they didn't want to talk or accept any information on programs that might help them meet their needs. All they wanted was for people to open their wallets and hand over cash.

The sad reality is that there are many people out there who need financial assistance. They are sincere, they are struggling, and they appreciate anything that can be done to help them. On the other hand, there are also a number of scam artists and swindlers out there, who prey on the good will of kind-hearted people. They're good at what they do, and they're good at trying to pressure you or make you feel guilty if you say no. They look for opportunities and easy targets—like a church full of people leaving Mass on a Sunday.

Obviously, I can't tell you what to do with your own money, but I do encourage you to be prudent, especially if someone approaches you here at the church. If that happens, don't feel obliged to open your wallet. You can always recommend they call the office, and I would suggest you also notify a priest, deacon, or staff member if you see someone asking for help on campus so we can assess and address the situation.

Here at the parish, we are fortunate to have an active Society of St. Vincent de Paul, to whom we refer anyone who comes to us asking for financial help. Your support of our monthly collections for the needy and your donations to the food pantry allow them to do their work. In turn, they practice good stewardship of your gifts by vetting those who are sent to them and providing help when it is warranted.

It is sad—actually, infuriating—that the liars and the cheats have made us so suspicious, but they are out there, and we don't want to fund their fraud if we can help it. Helping the poor is an essential aspect of our Christian life, and we all have an obligation to do so. Let's just be careful that we're actually helping those who really need it.
