

It was a number of years ago now that I was in Germany on Ash Wednesday. Ordinarily, I would be working at home, but I managed to get some coverage and time off. As I was preparing for Mass, I asked the sacristan, who was my good friend besides, to mix some water into the ashes in order to moisten them. "You want me to pour water into the ashes," he asked. "Yes," I said, "in order to moisten them." He gave me a strange look, but didn't question me any further, since priests are supposed to know what they're doing, especially on Ash Wednesday. Distributing ashes that day, I got more strange looks from the faithful that came to Mass. Afterwards, my buddy simply couldn't help but question why I had placed somewhat sticky, wet ashes on people's foreheads creating a little bit of a mess in the process – both literally and figuratively as some parishioners questioned what the heck I was doing. After a bit of confused conversation, we realized that there was more than one custom for the distribution of ashes and it was the American custom that was the exception. Most of the world receives dry ashes placed upon the crown of the head on Ash Wednesday. How our American custom started, I have no idea. My friend and I had a good laugh over the whole event and we both learned something new. I tell this story, because this Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of our Lenten Season. It is also almost a year since our whole COVID drama began – and, unfortunately, the drama continues. As I write this, the upper grades of our school are in quarantine per the health and safety guidelines when a case of the virus is reported. Also, I was just informed that the archdiocesan priest convocation is cancelled once again due to limitations on the size of gatherings. I am not even certain that I would have been able to attend anyway, since parish help is hard to find. I sure miss Father Furey. On Ash Wednesday, there will be Mass with the distribution of ashes at 8:30 am and Deacon Tom will lead a Prayer Service with the distribution of ashes at 7:00 pm. The guidelines from the Archdiocese offered several options, but I decided that the "old world" custom would work best, meaning that a bit of dry ashes will simply be placed on the crown of the head. This avoids the touching of each individual's forehead and the need for hand sanitizing in between, which would not be practical. Also, as we begin Lent, we recall that the Stations of the Cross have been a traditional devotion. Although individuals can always pray the Stations on their own (either at home or in church before/after Mass), I thought that it would be prudent to offer virtual Stations of the Cross, since devotional booklets ordinarily used in communal celebrations cannot be distributed. Our Virtual Stations will be available on the parish website. Finally, as we begin Lent, it is of note that there will be a very slight change in words of Mass regarding the concluding doxology of the Collects. The official English translation of the Roman Missal has been revised. "This change to the concluding doxology of orations is to be implemented on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021. The words 'one God, for ever and ever' are simply replaced with 'God, for ever and ever." Although this change seems very slight, it has to do with rendering an accurate English translation of the Latin and "the importance of affirming this Christological truth amid the religious pluralism of today's world." I think that I have to ponder this point just a little bit more myself. Well, now I have all of Lent to do so – as do you! Have a good Lent!

# Fast and Abstinence and Other Acts of Penance for Lent 2021

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (with the exception of Friday, March 19, The Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary). Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

### **Principal's Corner**




