FROM THE PASTOR

It's been a wild week weather-wise. Last weekend we had the storm that was supposed to hit us right as the 4:30 Mass was being celebrated on Saturday. After talking with our music director, Grete, we made the decision that we would not have music at the Saturday evening Mass so we could get everyone out of the church before the weather intensified. Of course, God had other plans, and the wintry weather didn't start until much later in the evening. Oh well

As I'm writing this, the Tuesday evening snow is falling. From what I can see looking out the window, cars are still whizzing by pretty quickly, so the roads must not be too bad. The school's admin team and I have been texting back-and-forth with updates on what local school districts are announcing regarding delays and closures. It still amazes me that these decisions are often made hours before the first snowflakes even fall. On the one hand it seems premature, but on the other giving parents more time to make childcare arrangements can lessen the inconvenience. We'll see what this storm brings, and then get ready for another storm or two as the week winds down. So, who's ready for Spring?

With all the winter weather, a quick reminder about our parish winter weather plans. The parish offices follow the parish school schedule when it comes to weather-related delays and closures. If the school is closed or virtual, the parish office will be closed. If the school is delayed, the office will be as well. Masses will still be offered as scheduled. Decisions about the opening/closing of the chapel are made as needed. Other meetings and activities may be held or cancelled as conditions warrant. Usually, we leave it up to the group leaders to make the call, but we also have to factor in the time and cost of clearing the parking lots and sidewalks and keeping them clear for an event, so sometimes we'll have to make a decision for everyone. We wouldn't want anyone to get hurt.

This time of year, we are gearing up for our sacrament celebrations for our parish children. Last weekend, 16 boys and girls celebrated the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation for the first time on Saturday morning. They are now preparing for their first Holy Communion in May. Our 7th graders are preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation, which will be celebrated at the 11:00 Mass on Sunday, March 9 when we welcome Bishop Esmilla to Holy Cross. It's an important time for all of these children, and it's a joy to see them celebrate these sacraments.

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Jeremiah 17: 5-8

The prophet contrasts the wicked of Judah, who resemble a desert shrub, with the righteous, who are like a thriving fruit tree drawing life from a nearby stream.

Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20

Corinthian skepticism about Christ's resurrection and the future of our bodies led to a decline of morality among the community. Paul teaches the truth of the resurrection and our true destiny of life eternal.

The Gospel: Luke 6: 17, 20-26

Here is "The Sermon on the Plain," much like Matthew's "Sermon on the Mount." (Mt. 5-7) Jesus envisions the negative conditions of this life being overturned in the next. The blessed will experience lasting peace.

The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle.

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.


