FROM THE PASTOR

Last chance to submit your orders for our Capt'n Chucky fundraiser! Orders are due by 11am Monday and need to be picked up between 3 and 7 on Wednesday. As I said previously, we have two meatless days this week, so this is a great way to support the parish and not have to worry about dinner one night.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Masses are at 8:30am and 7:00pm. The distribution of ashes is a sacramental of the Church. We begin our Lenten journey with a sign of our mortality (we are dust and to dust we shall return). The journey ends with the celebration of the Paschal Triduum, wherein we are given the hope of new life and Resurrection in Jesus. Ash Wednesday is a day for us to acknowledge our sinfulness and use the next forty days of Lent as an opportunity to grow in holiness and virtue. The ashes are an external reminder of a desire for interior conversion. As such, the Church prescribes that the distribution of ashes takes place in the context of a liturgical celebration, so that we can have the opportunity to reflect on what the ashes symbolize and the commitment we are making in receiving them. Some of our non-Catholic brethren have started to do things like "drive-through ashes" or similar opportunities to walk in, get a smudge, and go on your way in 30 seconds or less. That tends to diminish the meaning of the rite and devalue the symbolism.

The Office for Worship of the Archdiocese has reminded all the clergy that we are to follow the rites of the Church with regard to the distribution of ashes. Here at Holy Cross, ashes will only be distributed during the Masses on Ash Wednesday. In the past, I understand it was common for people to pick up containers of ashes to take home. That practice needs to be discontinued. Remember, Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation. If you can't make it to Mass that day, you don't need ashes to begin your Lenten journey. You can fruitfully enter into the season with a desire for repentance and conversion without an external reminder on your forehead.

A few other Lenten reminders:

- Don't forget to sign up for the Archbishop's weekly text message with practical tips on better deepening your faith. Texts begin on Ash Wednesday. Text *goforth* to 84576 to sign up or see the graphic on our website.
- Confessions will be heard during Lent Thursday mornings from 7:00-8:00 in addition to the usual Saturday afternoons from 3:30-4:15. Holy Cross has been chosen as a host parish for a special Archdiocesan Reconciliation Weekend on March 10 and 11, and we'll have more details on that soon.
- Stations of the Cross devotions will take place on Fridays at 2:00 and 7:00. School children will generally be attending at 2:00—and the devotional booklets for the younger kids will probably be more geared to their age
- The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023 and on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time
