It was a rather jarring phone call from his father. He called simply to ask for prayers for his son of just fifteen. I had just seen the boy at Mass over the weekend. All had been fine. Life usually is at fifteen. Vince was a freshman in high school and still yet an altar server as he had been throughout grade school, always present for special events at church. Vince was also a young man imbued with faith. Overall, he did well with his studies. It was in the locker room following swim team practice that teammates recognized that he needed help. Something wasn't right. Speech was slurred and movement became difficult. An ambulance was called as were his parents. I arrived at CHOP, parked the car, and made my way through the hospital labyrinth to his room. There were a couple of high school buddies present and his mother seated over in the corner. Vince himself, was propped up slightly in the hospital bed. I said, "Hey!" and greeted his mother first. She smiled saying, "Oh, Father!" as she thanked me for my unannounced coming. Then, she began to cry. Stand back, everyone! The Grim Reaper had arrived! I hope that she was just emotional for her son and I know for certain that she was happy that I had come to visit. Vince was not in any mortal danger. The stroke, so unusual for a teen, had had minimal effect and, to this day, it remains unexplained, but it did warrant my going to visit him at the hospital. Vince explained to me what had happened as best that he could recall. He explained to me that weird tingling sensation that he had had followed by numbness down one side of his body. He still did not have full use of his arm, but mobility and feeling were returning. He had youth on his side. This was all good news. I said that on hearing about what had happened from his dad, that I simply had to come visit and that I would like to anoint him, if that was okay. Both he and his mother assured me that it was. This was not a time of reaping grimly, but sowing happily and harvesting just a little fruit besides. It was an emotional anointing. This Sacrament is so often mistakenly connected with death, but today, it would be Life that literally oozed forth. Friends watched captivated by the mystery of the moment, while mom continued to cry. The Sacred Oil was inexplicably especially "oily" that day. Touching his forehead while making the Sign of the Cross with my thumb, the Oil ran down Vince's forehead, a bit on his nose, and then down his cheek. It looked like now, that he too, had tears from crying while I had to hold back my own. His hands, likewise, became rather slathered and shimmery covered in the holy hand cream that was this Holy Oil. I apologized for the "mess," but there was no need. Vince was soaking in that soothing balm in more ways than one. So was everyone else. I left that room dripping with Oil and immersed in an experience unlike any other. Vince would later begin to discern a call and religious vocation. The truth be told, it has not been easy for him. There have been many ups and downs, but he is still discerning. I can readily identify with him. I've been there. Paralyzed and provoked, still it seems, unable to move. I pray for him yet every day and now, maybe your prayers will help him as well. It seems to me that it all goes back, perhaps, to that day of anointing in that hospital bed, a day which both he and I will never forget. Priests do many different things, but the work of the Sacraments, I believe, is the greatest. Pray for vocations and pray for priests. Pray that a New Life of Faith might miraculously ooze forth for us all!
