First some good news. The new boiler is in, tuned up, inspected, and running. Yay! The installers added a new control module that helps to regulate both boilers' output based on time of day and outside temperature. In other words, less manual work for the staff to manually start and stop things, and a more efficient use of gas and electricity—which hopefully means some utility bill savings. Yay! Now please be patient, because we're still trying to figure out all the details of how it works, and the thermostats still aren't working, which brings me to...

The bad news. The tech was here several days in the past couple weeks looking at the thermostats and trying to get them to work. No such luck. Boo! I've mentioned before they aren't like the thermostats you have at home. These use a pneumatic system with tubes of air going to every thermostat. As I understand it (and remember, my degrees are in Theology, not heating system repair), there are leaks in the lines, probably because we're dealing with plastic or rubber tubing that is 60-some years old and may have cracked or experience dry rot. It's almost impossible to investigate further without severely damaging the marble walls or bringing in a bunch of marble experts to open them up. Boo!

So, it's back to the drawing board to look into changing to a different type of system altogether. Thankfully with wireless technology, we may have some options that will work well enough, though maybe not as well as we would like. But that will also require some more equipment, more time, and, yes, more cost. Yay, 21st-Century Technology! Boo, more time and money! At any rate, that's where we are. I will, of course, do my best to keep you updated.

Looking ahead, in the next couple weeks, we are also going to start a campaign to help raise funds to offset the cost of all these repairs to our heating and air conditioning system. I don't like asking for money (Boo!), but in this case, it's essential. Please consider making a sacrificial gift to help support these critical infrastructure upgrades. We'll have special envelopes available in the vestibules to the church and will be charting the progress. Thank you in advance for your generosity.

Also coming up soon, we will be launching the use of Flocknote in the parish. Flocknote is an electronic communication tool that allows us to be in touch with you via e-mail and possibly text message. If you gave us your information in the parish census in the Fall, we should (famous last words) automatically be able to add you to the list. So be on the lookout for that in the next week or so. Yay, more 21st-Century Technology!

Lent is only about a week away! (Yay? Boo? I don't know...) Our Adult Faith Formation and Evangelization group is running a three-session program based on the Forgiven Series from Formed. Not a huge time commitment for an invaluable opportunity. Please consider joining them to gain a deeper appreciation for and understanding of the Sacrament of Penance. Oh, and they'll have light refreshments available as well. Free food—Yay! The schedule for Confessions and Stations of the Cross are on our website, and hopefully will be e-mailed to you once we get Flocknote up and running.

In the meantime, wishing you all many more Yays than Boos in the week ahead!
