FROM THE PASTOR

A few weeks ago, I mentioned that Archbishop Perez issued a pastoral letter and began a new initiative to plan a new way forward as the Church of Philadelphia. As part of the rollout of this initiative, regional information sessions were going to be scheduled so people can come learn about the plan. Shortly after everything launched back in January, each parish was then asked to schedule parish-based information sessions as well. After working with the Archdiocesan Strategy Office to arrange a speaker, we have scheduled an information session for Holy Cross on Tuesday, March 4, at 2:00 pm in the Parish Center.

I realize that the time is not convenient for those who work during the day. In scheduling this, we had to consider the availability of a limited pool of presenters. We also have a good number of parishioners who are not fond of driving when it's dark, and so an evening presentation would have left them out. If you're unable to attend, you are welcome to attend one of the regional sessions, which are scheduled at various locations in Delaware Country throughout March, April, and May. For more information on locations or the initiative as a whole, you can visit the website trustandhope.org.

You may recall that three years ago, all parishes were asked to complete the Disciole Maker Index Survey put out by the Catholic Leadership Institute. We are being asked to do that again this year during Lent. This is another dimension of the planning for the future of the archdiocese, getting a sense of where parishioners are on their individual journeys of faith. Once I have more information on how to access the survey, I'll share it here.

Don't forget tomorrow is the last day to purchase tickets or name a horse for the Horse Race Night supporting Holy Cross School. Contact the school office for more information. It promises to be a fun-filled evening.

Finally, a gentle reminder that the parish office is closed on Fridays. We periodically experience situations that suggest some have forgotten this, such as voicemails or e-mails received on a Friday that get followed by more messages on Friday or Monday morning wondering why there hasn't been a reply yet. Others leave food pantry donations outside the office door on Fridays, which means they don't get noticed for a while. That happened last week, and the box got soaked by all the rain we had last weekend. We had to throw out most of the items, which is a shame since someone was trying to do a good thing in donating them. If you're going to drop off a donation to the food pantry, there are bins with lids at the parish center to keep your items safe from the weather—and the local squirrel population!

The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.


