FROM THE PASTOR

With today's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the Christmas Season comes to a close. Fr. Collins and thank all who sent cards and gifts to us at the rectory; your thoughtfulness is appreciated. I am also grateful for all those who contributed to the Christmas collection and to the Christmas Flower collection this year. Your generosity keeps this parish going.

We certainly had a large display of poinsettias around the altar this year! I've been learning more about the challenge we face in keeping them alive in our church. They like sunlight, but there's no natural light hitting the area in front of the altar. They don't like drafts, but we have forced air heat in the church. Also, when they don't get enough water, the leaves start to curl up and wilt. And when they get too much water, the leaves start to curl up and wilt. Go figure. A group of ladies did their best to keep them watered and cared for over the past couple weeks even though the odds were stacked against them, and I am thankful they stepped up.

Our first real snowstorm of the winter is behind us. I believe the school children (and teachers) enjoyed the extra day of Christmas break that came with the snowstorm, and I'm sure our plowing and salting contractor was glad for some business with the weather. One challenge we face with our parish campus is that there are lots of areas that don't get much sun in the winter. That gives lots of opportunities for melting snow to freeze instead of evaporate in the sunlight. We do our best to keep things clear when we get winter weather, but please be cautious when walking on the campus—slick spots are always a possibility.

The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle.

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.


