Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



Well, Winter finally decided to arrive recently, didn't it? A small snow storm, the chance of some freezing rain and ice, and a frigid blast of the coldest air we've seen in a couple years has been a vivid reminder of what season we are in right now. As I was getting ready to go stand in the car line outside the school on one of the colder days this past week, I had to think for a moment about where I put all the cold-weather gear when I moved in. The hats, gloves, and wool socks were the last thing on my mind as I was unpacking in the 100-degree days of July. Thankfully, I found them just in time.

With the burst of Winter weather, it seems like a good time to remind everyone to please be careful in our parking lot and on our sidewalks when you come on campus. I've come to learn that there are some areas on this campus that seem to be perpetually shaded, and can be slick and icy when you're not expecting it. (In case you want to know *how* I learned this valuable information; let's just say I'm thankful nobody was around and I was out of the view of the security cameras when I did my amateur figure skating routine unexpectedly the other day.)

The cold weather is also a good time to give an update on our new boiler. As of my writing this column, the new boiler has been installed. We are waiting for it to receive a final tuning and for it to be inspected before we fire it up. We had done some creative plumbing so that the one boiler could heat both the upper and lower churches, and it did a decent job of it thanks to the mild weather. Now that the new boiler is in, we've reset things to their normal state, which means it might be cooler in the church than we would like until we get the new machine running. The other morning, when it was around 20 degrees outside, the temperature inside of the church was still in the 60's, so we're holding our own. I've said it before and I'll say it again, thank you for your patience and dealing with discomfort as we work to get these systems working the way they should.

Now that Christmas is over, the church looks rather empty, doesn't it? I do have to say the church looked absolutely beautiful during the Christmas season, and we received a few compliments from visitors and parishioners alike. A number of dedicated parishioners and staff members were very generous in lending a hand to decorate—and even more generous in lending a hand to take everything down and clean up last Sunday! I am grateful for their help. Thank you also to those who gave to the Christmas flower fund; we were blessed with a good crop of poinsettias this year, and they gave the church a nice festive atmosphere. I should also mention a word of gratitude to the hard-working ladies who come in to clean the church periodically. They were in this past week, and they do a fine job keeping our building beautiful.

Finally, a reminder about our parish memorial opportunities. The sanctuary lamps in the church and chapel will be lit each week for a particular intention. We've established the memorial fund as a way to remember our deceased loved ones, with a Mass being offered once per month for those enrolled. Donations for sanctuary lamps and the Memorial Fund will be used to help us update some of our worn-out vessels and vestments when necessary. Please call the office for more information.
