Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



Happy Feast of the Epiphany! And Happy New Year! With the change of the calendar, it's time to make those New Year's resolutions—the chance to find areas for improvement in our lives and attempt to make some changes to better ourselves. Some things might be quick fixes; others take long-term planning, commitment, and dedication.

While we do that on a personal level, it's also good for us to consider this at a parish level. Like every parish, there are things we do well and things we can improve. Chances are you would agree with that statement. Where we would probably see disagreement is in deciding what area of parish life goes into which category. We have different perspectives, priorities, and styles, but that unity in diversity is a beautiful characteristic of the Church.

In the Spring, we will be participating in an Archdiocesan-wide initiative to help analyze where we are as a parish. You will be asked to take a survey, which will then help me and the Pastoral and Finance Councils identify strengths and weaknesses and discern where we go from there. The survey will give us a portrait of who you are and what your experience of the parish and the faith is. We can take that information and run with it to maintain what is already great and plan ways to grow/amend what is still needed. There is, of course, much more information to come, but I wanted to give you a heads-up now of what is coming up in the months ahead. Personally, I am happy that we will have this opportunity. We are a great parish with a bright future, and the more we can take advantage of tools to help us plan for that future, the better!

So that's a long-term project. Now for a quick fix. There are some weeks where there is a second collection and some weeks there is not. Sometimes we have additional envelopes (poor and needy, maintenance fund) that just go into the regular collection while other times there is an envelope for a special collection (missions) that does end up as a second collection. Sometimes the second collection gets forgotten; sometimes people are handing in envelopes after Mass they thought would be in the second collection. Bottom line: it's confusing. On top of that, taking up a second collection can be a bit cumbersome and time-consuming, especially when we don't have a full complement of ushers to help. The collection shouldn't take more time than the homily or the Eucharistic Prayer!

To make life easier all around, there will only be one collection at Mass. Any envelopes you have for a particular week should be placed in the basket when the collection is taken up. I've seen this practice in a number of parish and it seems to work well. Having said that, there may be occasions where we do have an actual second collection for some particular reason (thinking something like disaster relief when we don't have an actual envelope), but that will be announced and publicized.

Finally, a collective note of thanks from me and on behalf of Fr. Kelly, the deacons, and the parish and school staff to everyone who sent cards, notes, or gifts for Christmas. Your kindness and support is very much appreciated. God bless you all in this new year!

TAX SAVINGS FOR YOU / GIFT TO HOLY CROSS

If you are age 70 ½ or older, the best way to make a charitable contribution can be through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from a traditional IRA. A QCD can satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year and reduce your income taxes.

The tax benefit of giving from and IRA is greater than writing a check and taking a tax-deduction. Such gifts are also wellsuited if you are subject to the RMD, but no longer itemize deductions for income tax purposes.

Suppose your RMD for the year is \$10,000-. Make at least \$10,000 of QCDs and you have satisfied your RMD and avoided income tax on the distribution. The money is out of your tradi-

tional IRA, but there is no gross income on your tax return. For a charitable distribution from and IRA to qualify as a QCD, the contribution must be made directly from the IRA custodian or trustee to the charity.




