# FROM THE PASTOR

I hope I'm not jinxing us by saying this, but thus far, we've had a fairly mild winter. We did that super cold snap around Christmas, but otherwise, temperatures outside seem to have been at or above average for the most part (including a couple of rather warm stretches for January). On the one hand, I rather enjoy a cold, snowy, winter day. On the other hand, I have to sign the checks that pay the bills to heat our enormous church, school, parish center, rectory, and convents; a mild winter is much milder on our budget!

By now you know that our heating and air conditioning system has caused us a number of challenges because there is no workable way to regulate the temperature in the building. In the heating season, we have to manually turn different systems and components on and off and adjust them based on outside temperature and what events are happening in the church. To be honest, it's a pain. And it leads to big temperature swings in the church—it could be 65 degrees in there one day and 80 the next. That's not comfortable for you in the pews, and an 80 degree church is not exactly comfortable for the priest wearing a couple extra layers of vestments either.

We are in the process of installing a new control panel and related equipment for the heat. It's not a small project. Old equipment has to be removed, control valves have to be upgraded, and a new panel has to be put in and connected to everything. The new controller will allow for some measurement of conditions to take place and adjust the boilers and other system components accordingly. It won't be a perfect system (we are on a budget), but it should give us much better control and hopefully keep the temperature steadier in the church. If all goes according to plan, installation will have started this past week, and it should be operational by the end of this month. Fingers crossed.

This Monday has been designated by the US Bishops as a nationwide day of prayer for the legal protection of the unborn. The cause of life received a great victory last year in the Supreme Court's reversal of Roe v. Wade. At the same time, the need for us to be stalwart witnesses of the dignity and sanctity of human life continues as the battle to secure legal rights for the unborn is now being waged in so many states. The Bishops have asked us to make Monday a day of prayer and sacrifice for this important intention.

Next week is Catholic Schools' Week. Our school faculty and the Home and School Association are both working on ways to celebrate the good that happens in our parish school.
