Killing wasn't my intention really, though maiming was. At nine or ten, I certainly would have been no match for a sixteen or seventeen-year-old who was tormenting the daylights out of me. Perhaps, it would be better to say that he was tormenting the devil out of me. It was summer. We were staying at the hotel in Wildwood Crest where my mother, father, aunt, and two cousins always stayed in my early grade school years. It was a beautiful, warm, and sunny day in late July and we were all outside and by the small hotel pool. I don't remember exactly what the torment was, though it was inflicted by the same cousin who would dangle me upside down by my ankles over the stairway banister from the second floor of the house while I struggled and screamed. He would say, "Don't worry! I won't drop you!" Gee, thanks. That day, I had had enough. It was hot on the outside; I was hot on the inside. My Irish blood was boiling over and my German blood began to plot and plan revenge. It was my Scottish blood that determined to exact a price that was to be paid with his blood. On the table was a shiny, new, and full Heinz Ketchup bottle. Its 57 Varieties would pack the perfect punch and the bottle was the perfect size for my hand. It wasn't a 21<sup>st</sup> century plastic bottle, but the good old-fashioned heavy glass bottle of the 20<sup>th</sup>. I snapped. Whatever it was that he said; whatever it was that he did, I snapped. He laughed and took one step back when I approached, upsidedown bottle in hand. "Ha, big tough guy, yeah, I'm scared," he snorted. I took one hard swing and came, I guess, within an inch or so of that thing on his shoulders that supposedly contained a brain. Then, he ran. I followed. Not paying attention, he got tripped up in some pool side shrubbery. If it wasn't for the swift intervention of a screaming mother of mine and my father raging at both me and my cousin while wresting the bottle out of my hand, then there would now be some other priest writing, I'm sure, a very lovely, sweet, and non-violent story about friendship, family, and faith. All I know is that back then, I was seething with rage and anger. All I could see was a bloody ketchup bottle in a police evidence bag and a whole lot of years in juvenile detention. Well, I guess that it would have been a seminary of sorts. To this day, glass ketchup bottles carry me back to that day of torment and anger on which a devil was unleashed. A little respect would have gone such a long way. Sure, boys will be boys, but couldn't we have just made more of an effort to get along. It was vacation time for crying out loud! It still is vacation time for all of us in the sense that we are all away from our True Homeland. With MLK Day, this past week was a time to consider injustices in our country both past and present and especially, the injustice of abortion, which is a fundamental disrespect for human life. It's time to put down the ketchup bottles of our rage and anger. It's time for an intervention and it's time to grow up. The respect that's owed to one another; the respect for life isn't because of anything that any one of us has done. It's because of what God did – and still does. Respect need not be earned. It's something inherent to human life made in God's Image and Likeness. My cousin and I grew up. We matured. I still have my doubts, at times, about that thing on his shoulders and the brain it supposedly contains, but we respect each other and love each other to this day – even if he does yet flinch every time that I reach for a ketchup bottle!


