FROM THE PASTOR

Happy Catholic Schools' Week! Our parish school will be celebrating this week with various activities for our students. Feel free to stop by after the 11:00 Mass for the school's open house. You'll have a chance to meet our teachers and see the great work that goes on in Holy Cross School.

It may seem hard to believe, but we are just over two weeks away from the start of the Holy Season of Lent! Ash Wednesday is on February 14. For Catholics, the beginning of the Lenten Season and the sign of repentance signified by the reception of ashes takes precedence over any other celebrations we might desire that day. So if you're planning a fancy dinner with your beloved to mark a holiday on the 14th, you probably ought to move it to the day before.

The 2024 Catholic Charities Appeal for the Archdiocese has begun. By now you've probably received information in the mail about the appeal and what it helps to fund. Your support is appreciated. So many of you also support the social outreach of our parish by donating to our St. Vincent DePaul Society to assist the poor and needy and operate our food pantry. We have some very generous people in our parish.

The winter weather two weeks ago was a nice reminder of what season of the calendar year we are in. It also gave us an opportunity to evaluate parish operations in the event of bad weather. Our primary concern is everyone's safety. We have a lot of ground that must be plowed, shoveled, and salted when it's snowy or icy, and it takes time. Under most circumstances, in times of bad weather, we will still have Masses as scheduled. Other events and activities may be cancelled. Also, please note going forward that if Holy Cross School is delayed or closed, the parish offices will be delayed or closed as well.

Any time you come onto the campus in the winter, please be careful. We have several areas that never seem to see sunlight based on the shadows of the buildings and trees. They can get icy quickly. The driveway behind the rectory is especially bad for this. And you probably noticed last week one of our downspouts froze, which caused water to pour onto the pavement in front of the doors to the church and create a nice big sheet of ice. How long till Spring? I guess we'll have to see what the groundhog says on Friday.

Pasta Dinner


