Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



Hello? "Hey, Gene! Connie said that the parameters for the panel cover on 3351 were incorrect and the overlay was off also." Huh? What? "Oh, is this Little Gene?" Yeah (sigh). "Ohhhh, okay. Hey, it's Eddie. Is your Dad there? Boy, you guys sound just alike!" Hold on (sigh again). I'll get him (third sigh). Holding my head just a bit higher since my voice had been confused with that of my father, I would go find my Dad to let him know that the phone call was for him. At the same time, I was just a little bit ruffled that I was still "Little Gene," i.e., still a boy. I was eager to be a part of the adult world of panel covers, overlays, and 3351s – whatever they were. Now looking back, I very much miss those days of mistaken identity. Boys often go through a period of having their voices confused with that of their fathers. It falls usually somewhere between eighth grade through the sophomore year of high school. It is a time of transition and maturing with a few girly squeaks interspersed. There is a certain pride in boys as their voices change and deepen. The accompanying facial fuzz speaks to a boy slowing becoming a man. One's voice is becoming confused with that of the father. I remember having a conversation with my mother for a couple of minutes about something or other. I was listening and answering although I had no idea about what she was talking. This was, perhaps, a typical conversation between boys and their mothers. Maybe it speaks to the larger conversations between men and women in general. I'll leave that up to you. All I know is that when my mother entered from the other room, she appeared just a bit flustered realizing that she had been speaking not with her husband, but her freshman son. My mother's cheeks were rosy and aglow! All boys go through a period when their voices change. The process of maturing causes their voices to deepen. Before the change is complete, there are usually just a few squeaks in the voice as well. Others might snicker and laugh. When the change is complete however, a growing child's voice sounds like that of his father. There is a certain pride in the sound of that voice and certain displeasure if one is seen as still being immature and "little." The mature Christian is called to echo the Voice of the Father. This includes both men and women. As Christians mature there will definitely be moments of squeaks and a cracking voice. The laughter and snicker of others might ensue. There will definitely be moments of fluster and embarrassment. There will be moments of confusion as to who is really speaking, but the goal of every Christian need be to speak with the very Voice of the Father. We need that Voice of the Father spoken in our world today more so than ever. So, clear your throat and say a prayer. Hold your head high and pray that in your voice all might hear the Voice of the Father!


