Several parishioners were confused that New Year's Day wasn't a Holy Day of Obligation this year. The situation with the holy days is a bit confusing to keep track of, so here's a brief explanation. In 1991, the US Bishops established six Holy Days of Obligation for the USA: (1) January 1: Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God; (2) Ascension Thursday; (3) August 15: Assumption of Our Lady; (4) November 1: All Saints' Day; (5) December 8: Immaculate Conception of the BVM; and (6) December 25: Christmas.

At the same time, they also established that if January 1, August 15, or November 1 fall on a Saturday or Monday, then the day is not observed as a Holy Day of Obligation. As I understand it, the rationale was that two days of obligation in a row could be a burden, not just to the people, but especially for priests. Having just celebrated six Masses in 48 hours, I can appreciate the sentiment. At least I only have one parish/church. But I can't imagine the exhaustion of priests who have to care for multiple places. I know of a place where two priests cover eight churches, all 10-30 miles apart from one another. The normal Sunday routine has to be demanding enough, let alone doing it two days in a row.

So, three of the six holy days aren't days of obligation when they fall on a Saturday or Monday. The Immaculate Conception, Christmas, and the Ascension are always Holy Days of Obligation, regardless of the day of the week on which they fall.

Well, sort of. In 1999, the US Bishops decided that each Ecclesiastical Province (Church adminspeak for a regional grouping of dioceses) could decide to transfer the Ascension to the next Sunday if the bishops of the region decided to do so, which has happened everywhere except Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New York, Connecticut, and Nebraska. There's also a unique situation we'll see this year with the Immaculate Conception. When December 8 falls on a Sunday, the 2nd Sunday of Advent takes precedence. The celebration of the Immaculate Conception is moved to the 9th, but without an obligation to attend Mass. But if December 8 naturally falls on a Monday, there is an obligation to attend Mass.

Confused? Understandably. There is logic and reasoning behind the way things are, even if at first glance it seems like convoluted mess. Lots of people (clergy and laity) are happy to spout an opinion on "how it ought to be." My job is to try and explain what is. Hopefully the above did that.



In this course on the Fathers of the Church, we shall delve deeply into the writings of the first Christian centuries (up to the Council of Nicaea in 325) and become acquainted with such figures as St. Clement of Rome, St. Ignatius, St. Justin Martyr, St. Irenaeus, Tertullian, St. Cyprian, and Origen, and come to an appreciation of their specific genius and their legacy for our own generation. We shall also devote some time to the principles of the theological discipline of Patristics, which in turn will shed light on the usefulness of the Fathers in our own theological reflection.
