Please call Deacon Thomas Taylor or the Parish Office when a parishioner is hospitalized or home bound.


FROM THE PASTOR

We start the year off with some good news. As you know, our convent building has been unoccupied since the departure of the Sisters of Mercy in 2021. I'm happy to announce that we are welcoming a group of young ladies as residents of our convent. These ladies are young women who desire to live together in a type of community life, with common meals and communal prayer, while they work in their respective jobs and careers. Note: they are not religious sisters or nuns; they are lay women with a deep commitment to their faith. They're in the process of moving in and getting settled. Their presence will be a blessing to our parish, and we look forward to having them live here.

As part of welcoming them to the parish, we all have to ensure we are accommodating their needs. One need in particular concerns parking. When the sisters left the convent, it became common for parishioners to park in the convent parking lot. Now that the convent will again be occupied, we have to leave that lot available to the residents. Going forward, **please do not park in the convent parking lot** when you come onto the campus. I realize that we do not have the most convenient parking lots out there and parking can be a challenge, and I appreciate your cooperation in this regard.

I've mentioned previously that Holy Cross is undergoing a process of renewal and pastoral planning in conjunction with the Catholic Leadership Institute called the **Next Generation Parish**. We have officially moved into the "Envisioning" phase, a time to discern and proclaim a vision for Holy Cross that will help us all grow spiritually and attract new parishioners. Along with that will be establishing priorities that we will focus on in the coming years. The team met this past week for the first time. This program has the potential to be of great benefit to our parish, and I ask everyone to pray for its success. I'll provide updates on our progress as they are available.

We have a few other projects going on right now as well, and I'll have updates on them coming up in future bulletins. Stay tuned. It's going to be a great year here at Holy Cross!
