

The liturgical season of Christmas officially comes to a close today with the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Fortunately, Ash Wednesday and Easter are later this year, so we have a little more breathing room and planning time than usual before things ramp up again for Lent. That delay is especially helpful when you're a rookie pastor still trying to figure out the routine of the parish, and even more so when that routine has been disrupted for two years by a pandemic. Let the planning begin!

Speaking of the pandemic, I hate to bring it up, but I think I should. We've all seen/heard/read stories about the surge in Covid cases over the past few weeks, especially with the latest variant. As of the day/time I am writing this column, the Archdiocese has not made issued any modifications to the Covid mitigation protocols to be followed in the celebration of the Mass or the Sacraments. (Of course, with my luck, the bulletin will go to print and an e-mail will arrive a few minutes later!)

The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is in effect, understanding as always that the obligation does not apply to those who are seriously ill, have a serious health risk, or must care for those who cannot attend Mass in person. In-person celebration of the Mass and Sacraments is so critical for our spiritual and psychological well-being that out of charity and respect for one another, we all should be motivated to ensure a welcoming environment where everyone can feel comfortable joining in worship as a community of faith. The wearing of masks by those who are fully vaccinated is not required but is left to each person's discretion. I've noticed more people are wearing masks in the pews, and if doing so makes you feel more comfortable, please feel free to do so. We do have hand sanitizer located in the entrances, and I encourage everyone to thoroughly wash his hands before coming to Mass and to use the provided hand sanitizer when entering the church. Lastly, we have (happily) a big enough church building and (sadly) a small enough Mass attendance that social distancing should not be a problem. Let us be respectful of one another's comfort zones when it comes to spacing. If someone asks you to sit a little further away, please don't be offended. And if someone sits a little too close, please be polite in expressing your concern. Everyone is processing things and responding in his own way, and we can and should respect that we may have differences in how we do.

Please remember that the exchange of the Sign of Peace between members of the faithful, which is always optional to begin with, remains suspended. After the priest offers the Peace of the Risen Christ to the whole congregation, we proceed directly to singing the *Lamb of God*. I'm noticing that some people are doing their own variant of the Sign of Peace anyway, which can be a bit distracting and confusing for others.

Outside of Mass, we are continuing to have all normal parish activities and events, with similar Covid mitigation measures in place. I'm sure we all dream (and pray) for the time when this will all be over. Until then, let us be prudent and charitable in looking out for our own health and for that of one another.
