

I'm going to start by stealing a couple lines from my last bulletin column from my previous parish. (It's not plagiarism if you steal material from yourself, right?) One of my biggest challenges each week is writing the bulletin column. Often, I forget about it and get caught up in other things until I get the dreaded "Father, are you going to have something for the bulletin this week?" message when the deadline looms. Then, the clock is ticking, and trying to write something coherent and informative isn't always easy. The frenzy that comes with being new and trying to get settled into a new home and workplace makes it challenging to be coherent. I'm still trying to learn the basics (like which key unlocks the rectory) so I feel like I'm the last person that should be providing anyone any kind of reliable information about parish life right now.

So, to start this week, a bit about me. I was born and raised in Stroudsburg, PA, up in the Pocono Mountains. I moved to Southeastern PA after graduating from Penn State with a degree in math, and I worked for seven years as an analyst for a health insurance company. Eventually the vocation bug bit me, and I left my career and sold my home to enter the seminary. I was ordained a priest in 2015, and spent the next few years serving as a parochial vicar in different parishes. Last summer, I was assigned as parochial administrator of St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother Parish in Stowe, and then I was asked to come here to Holy Cross as the pastor a few weeks ago. For the past couple years, I have served as the Spiritual Director for a young adult group in Montgomery County, and I was also appointed as an Assistant Master of Ceremonies for Archbishop Perez last year.

These six years of priestly ministry have been filled with a lot of great moments and a number of challenges. As I start this new assignment, I am looking forward to enjoying many great moments here while confronting whatever challenges we need to face. We'll do that together, with the help of God and relying on His providence.

I do want to take a moment to offer a few words of gratitude right way. I'm grateful to our resident priest, Fr. Kelly, for his warm welcome to the rectory as I moved in and for his help in getting acclimated to the area. And I am very grateful to the various members of the parish staff who have been working hard to help me learn the routine around here and gotten me up to speed with regard to important things on the calendar. And finally, I'm very grateful to all of you parishioners who have already taken a moment to say hello and offer a welcoming greeting. Sadly, I'm not great with recognizing and remembering names and faces, so I ask your forgiveness if every time we see each other I have to ask "who are you/what do you do?" until I figure it out. But again, thank you all for the welcome. Please pray for me as I begin this ministry, and know that you are in my prayers as well.
