Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



FROM THE PASTOR

A couple months ago, I heard about a Catholic Heart Work Camp being hosted at Bonner & Prendie High School the last week of June. Teens from across the country would be coming to Delco to be sent out in groups to do various service projects involving manual labor. Local priests were asked for service project ideas. It didn't take long to come up with one. The suite formerly occupied by Msgr. Curran in the rectory was in desperate need of attention. There was a lot of stuff in the room that needed to be thrown out, and the space needed major cleaning and painting. The thought of free labor was too good to resist, so I wrote in and asked for us to be considered. A leader organizing the camp came out to look, and she told me she'd send a cohort of 10-12 people to tackle the project. We pay for the paint and cleaning products; they supply the brushes and the labor. Perfect! I told her if she had other teens she needed to place on projects, I was sure I could find more things that needed some TLC around here.



Be careful what you wish for. I found out the day before they were to arrive that instead of a group of 10-12, we were being sent a group of 23! On four sweltering days at the end of June, just about two dozen teens and adult chaperones (see the photo) were here at Holy Cross cleaning and painting in the rectory and helping with some cleaning in the school. It was a great effort, and I was so thrilled to be able to welcome them—and even more thrilled that we got some long overdue work done with minimal expense.

Some other news to share. I am happy to welcome Mr. Daniel Salvatore as the new principal of Holy Cross School. Mr. Salvatore has served as a teacher and principal at several area Catholic Schools. He is committed to helping our students to succeed academically and to become future saints as disciples of Jesus Christ. Please keep him in your prayers as he begins this important ministry in our parish.


