

One of the joys/challenges that comes with being the new priest in a parish is that you get to meet a lot of people very quickly. And many of those people will be very quick to let you know what "ought to be done around here." That's a good thing: it shows people care and want the parish to succeed in its mission. It can also be overwhelming: lots of ideas and suggestions coming at you from all angles, all while you're still trying to figure out where your toothbrush is.

In any environment with a leadership change, it's usually a good idea for the new leader to settle in and assess the state of the place before making any big changes or running with any new ideas. The same applies to a parish. At its core, the mission of our parish is to worship God and form holy Christian disciples. If you have ideas, suggestions, thoughts, or complaints to help us live that mission more fully, great! I want to hear them. But please be patient and understand that we can't run full steam ahead with every idea immediately.

That being said, this is an early heads-up for some tweaks that will be coming after the Summer. I'm expecting that we will adjust the daily Mass schedule slightly in the Fall. Also, I'm looking into moving the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance back into the upper church. I've heard it's a challenge for some people to navigate the stairs to get to the current reconciliation room, and I'll be honest, it can be a little dark and spooky down there. More information will follow on these items as decisions are made.

As we emerge from the pandemic, we're also looking at adjustments that were made to how we celebrate Mass over the past year in response to the pandemic. Now is a good opportunity for us to look at what the celebration of Mass and sacraments is supposed to look like in general and move in that direction, while still following appropriate safeguards for health and safety.

In that vein, we should be reminded that the exchange of the Sign of Peace between members of the congregation remains suspended at this time. The Peace of the Risen Christ (present on the altar) is offered from the priest to the whole congregation. We then move immediately to the Fraction Rite and the singing of the Lamb of God. The exchange of the Sign of Peace between members of the congregation is always an optional element of Mass.

Another pandemic-related note is regarding mask-wearing. If you are wearing a mask to Mass and intend to receive Holy Communion in the hand, please be sure to remove the mask before you extend your hands to receive Holy Communion. Once you've consumed the Sacred Host, you can put your mask back on. At times people will receive the Host while still wearing a mask, and then it becomes a challenge for them to try and reverently consume the Host. At that moment, our attention should be on the presence of Christ coming to us in the Sacrament, and having the mask off ahead of time helps us to avoid distraction in that moment. Plus, there's less chance of dropping the Host that way. (Of course, if you are receiving in the traditional way on the tongue, you pretty much have to remove your mask before you can receive the Host, so the preceding paragraph doesn't really apply.)

For a strengthening of the moral life,


For a bolder witness to the truth of the Gospel.
