FROM THE PASTOR

This week, we celebrate Independence Day on Tuesday. There will be Mass at 8:30 am. The parish offices will be closed for the holiday.

Next weekend, our parish will host a priest as part of our participation in the Missionary Cooperative Plan. Father will preach at all Masses about the work of his community in serving the poor and proclaiming the message of Jesus to them. It's good for us to be occasionally reminded of the work being done and the needs of the Church in other parts of the world and to assist in that work through our own prayerful and financial support.

That being said, if we look around, there's a lot of mission work that needs to be done right here in our own community. The Pew Research Center conducts periodic surveys on religious affiliation in the USA. Compare the numbers between 2007 and 2021. (Numbers are rounded)

The "non-Christian" category groups together all those who identify as belonging to some faith tradition: Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist, etc. The "no religion" category includes those who indicated they were atheist, agnostic, or nothing in particular.

The study provided further breakdowns of that data. While there was slight growth in atheist and agnostic, the real growth is in the response of "nothing in particular." The numbers in non-Christian faiths are pretty stable, which means the growth in people with no religion is happening at the expense of the Christians. By the way, of those who do have a religious affiliation, the study showed 68% attended religious services a few times of year or less and 33% reported that their religion is not too important or not at all important in their lives.

To put this another way, not long after the founding of our parish, just about every house in Westbrook Park was occupied by a Catholic family who attended Mass every Sunday and enrolled all their baby boom children in our parish school. Nowadays, if you sampled 10 houses, 3 of them would be occupied by people with no religion; 1 would be occupied by families who are Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, or Buddhist; and 4 would be occupied by Christians who don't see the inside of a church more than once or twice a year. Only 2 would be occupied by people whose religious practice imitates that of the folks that overwhelmed the area two or three generations ago.

If you're reading this now, that suggests you're one of those two, and there are eight other houses up and down your street the need to hear the message of Jesus Christ. So, a question for your reflection today: how can you reach out to one of them to help turn the data around?



Reading I: 2 Kings 4: 8-11, 14-16a

The Shunammite woman offers hospitality to Elisha the prophet with generosity and kindness. She does not yet know exactly who he is.

Reading II: Romans 6: 3-4, 8-11

The baptismal ritual represents the death, burial and resurrection of Christ. The convert to the Faith emerges as a new person, now living "for God in Christ Jesus."

The Gospel: Matthew 10: 37-42

Whoever receives an Apostle receives Christ. He insists that we take up our individual cross and follow Him, showing care for the needy as did the Shunammite woman.
