FROM THE PASTOR

On behalf of the parish, I want to thank Fr. Celestine Madubuko for joining us last week as part of the Church's Missionary Cooperative Plan and speaking to us about the needs of the Church in his home diocese of Nigeria. If you wish to make a contribution to the Missionary Co-op Appeal, envelopes are available at the entrances to the church and can be placed in the collection on Sundays over the next few Sundays.

I feel like I have to share something that happened this past week. We received a four-digit invoice for some repair work that had to be done around here. The same day, we opened a Maintenance Fund envelope, and one of the envelopes contained a check that happened to be for the amount of the invoice! What are the odds that you would get a bill for \$x and a random check for \$x on the exact same day? I'm reminded of when Mother Angelica was starting up the TV network that would become EWTN, she had ordered a satellite dish for the network without having the money in the bank to pay for it. She and the nuns prayed and trusted, and on the day of delivery (which was evidently COD), someone called the convent and wanted to make a huge donation that just happened to be what the satellite dish would cost.

These things aren't just coincidences. They are signs that God's providence is at work. We have a lot of capital improvements to undertake here at the parish. Finding a way to afford them is a challenge. But I'm trusting in God. If He wants it done, if He thinks it's worth doing, then He will find a way to make it happen. That's Divine Providence at work.

On the subject of capital projects, we are still working on our heating and air conditioning in the church. I hope you're not tired of me continually talking about the topic in this space, but I feel some sense of transparency is important here. We had an engineer come in to look at the entire A/C system and all its different components to assess how the system works and why it isn't working as it should. The good news is that he identified the causes of many of the issues and came up with a series of recommendations. The bad news is that there is no simple (or inexpensive) fix. But if we don't make some of those fixes, the result could be the failure of the whole system—not something we want during all this summer heat!

So, we trust in Divine Providence to help us make the right decisions and to provide the financial resources necessary to move forward. And we continue to thank the parishioners who have responded to our needs by their contributions to the Tame our Temp envelopes. Some generous souls have been very kind in making a number of gifts over the past few months. That is a blessing.

As we approach the end of July, we're finalizing the parish and school calendars for the upcoming year. We have a few big events planned in the Fall, and I can't wait. It'll be nice to spend some time and effort planning things that more directly focus on the spiritual, sacramental, and social life of the parish. More info to follow!

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Genesis 18: 20-32

After God announces His plan, a dialogue follows between Him and Abraham, in which Abraham is a bargainer. He makes daring proposals to God, but along the way he models persistence in prayer.

Reading II: Colossians 2: 12-14

Paul instructs the community of the fact that by their union with Christ, there is forgiveness of sin. This in turn is connected with their baptism, in which they died and rose with Christ.

The Gospel: Luke 11: 1-13

Jesus provides a catechism on prayer which stresses persistence as an essential component. This is particularly difficult for First World citizens, surrounded by a glut of "time saving" gadgets.


