FROM THE PASTOR

Well, the back-to-school sales are going on in earnest. I think I get at least two e-mail messages a day from every clothing and office-supply store reminding me of all kinds of great sales on stuff that I don't need for the children I don't have. When I was a kid, back-to-school shopping meant new sneakers, several new outfits, some notebooks & folders, and a box or two of pencils and pens. Today, it seems the list of things parents need to buy their children for school has grown, and grown much more costly as more technology is brought into the classroom.

It's no different at our parish school. For many families, the cost to send a child to a Catholic School is simply out of reach. Tuition rates go up annually, as does the cost of uniforms and supplies. We are doing our best to keep our tuition rates as low as possible, and as of the last time I checked, we are still one of the least expensive schools to attend in the area. But the fact remains, affording a Catholic education is a real struggle for many families.

We are fortunate to receive a considerable pool of financial aid to help families afford an education at Holy Cross School. I've spoken before about the state-sponsored programs that provide tax rebates for scholarship donations. The past few years, we benefited from these programs because people and businesses from all over the state made undesignated donations to the scholarship organization, and they in turn gave us a good chunk of those monies. A few months ago, after we set our tuition rates, we learned that the scholarship organizations were expecting to have a smaller pool of funds to disburse for this year. There's a more lot that I could write about how all that played out, but let's just say the whole thing was a source of great frustration.

Bottom line: our pool of financial aid for the upcoming year is about 30% lower than it was last year. And that's having an impact. We've already had some families say they can't afford it and are looking to move their children to a public school. Others are on the fence. They want their kids here, and we want their kids here. But we have to pay our bills and be fair to all of our families, which puts us in a tight spot.

Why am I writing this? Well, we have a lot of generous people in this parish. Maybe someone reading this will be prompted to participate in the state scholarship programs. Or maybe someone will remember that we have a scrip program which allows people to buy gift cards and provide tuition assistance just by doing their normal shopping. Or maybe someone reading this has a stack of \$100 bills he/she just doesn't know what to do with and would like to donate them to help families afford our school. (Wouldn't that be a nice problem to have....) If any of the people described above sounds like you, please contact Terry in the parish office for more information.

CAN YOU NOT SPEND I HOUR WITH ME??



The Eucharistic miracles Lanciano in Italy occurred in the 8th century. A certain priest developed doubts about Christ's presence in Eucharist. One day after consecration, during Mass, the wine and bread visibly turned into blood and flesh. This was preserved through the centuries. In 1970-71 and in 1981. scientist Odoardo Linoli, a professor of pathological histology, clinical microscopy and chemistry as well as anatomy, investigated the miracle.

The professor came to the conclusion that the flesh was cardiac tissue containing veins, nerve fibers and arterioles. The blood type matched with the blood type of other Eucharistic miracles, namely AB. The WHO too verified the finding of the Italian doctors, and after 500 examinations expressed the inability of science to explain Eucharistic miracles Lanciano.


