# FROM THE PASTOR

As a priest, I've been blessed to have had several assignments before coming here to Holy Cross. I've had a chance to see how different administrative tasks are handled in different places and to kind of assess what approaches and ways of doing things I thought worked well and what I thought maybe didn't go so well. It comes in handy when faced with a "how do we handle this" situation: well, something like that happened at St. So-and-so's and we did X and it worked well, so let's try X. (Or we did Y and it was a disaster: don't do Y.) Sometimes, though, the blessing becomes a curse. It's easy enough to remember how things were done in other places and forget how they're done at the current place!

A few weeks ago, Franciscan Friar Fr. Greg Plata was here from Indiana to speak on behalf of the Missionary Cooperative Appeal, with a collection to support the work of that particular community. The mechanics of that collection vary from parish to parish. I've been in parishes take up a second collection for the Mission Co-op appeal, while others include it with the regular collection via special envelopes. Some parishes send those envelopes home with the regular envelope mailing, and others leave them in the pews or the church entrances. Lots of options.

I thought we were one of the parishes that send the envelopes home. Ooops. We're not. We're one of the parishes that normally put special envelopes in the vestibules or pews—which makes sense because we never know when the Mission Co-op speaker will be visiting, and the envelope company wants a finalized list of envelopes to mail for a year in April the year before. Also complicating things is that we do send an envelope for World Mission Sunday, which is a completely different collection in October—for which there may be a guest speaker as well.

So, because I assumed (ahem—we know what that does), we didn't really give people an opportunity to support the Missionary Cooperative Collection. If you wish to make a contribution in support of the work of the Franciscan friars, you can place it in a separate envelope in the regular collection, clearly marked Missionary Co-op. Sorry for any confusion on that. Hopefully we get it right next year.




