


Please call Deacon Thomas Taylor or the Parish Office when a parishioner is hospitalized or home bound.




Jake is a fine young man working towards the rank of Eagle Scout. He approached me some time ago wanting to know if I could assist him in earning his badge. He needed to begin a service project which is always a part of earning the Eagle rank and he had thoughts of perhaps doing something for his parish here at Holy Cross. I've worked with any number of Scouts over the years. They are a fine group of young men. I've met with Cubs and Webelos helping them to earn their religious emblems. Some troops provided Christmas trees



to the church, grateful for permission to sell the rest outside in the parking lot. Scouts I've known have also collected food and other items for the needy. Although I was never a Scout myself, I have offered the invocation and blessing at quite a number of Eagle Scout Ceremonies. I even remember giving one young man the collar from around my neck – literally. Well, everyone else was giving him presents that day and I wanted to give him one as well, unusual as it was. I told him to keep it saying that you might need it one day. He blushed just a little. One of my first experiences as a newly ordained priest was with Scouting. I made the trek to Treasure Island well before the Delaware River swallowed it in a flood. The boys were camping there and I went to say Sunday Mass for them. I was surprised it wasn't raining that day. Most Scouts seem to know that Boy Scout camping trips, for some reason, always involve rain. It's all part of the fun and experience of Scouting. By the way, that day on Treasure Island, after Mass, I had simply the best oil-cooked turkey ever! That turkey was done in about ten minutes or so! The adult Scout Masters asked me not to give away their secret recipe! Scouts and Scouting are a permanent part of our Americana. I told Jake my thoughts for a project and he then set about his work. You may have noticed it already. Some privacy fencing was added to the founding pastor's grave area along with an additional bench. I would like this area to be known as a little prayer garden and, in particular, as the Tom Bunting Memorial Prayer Garden. Tom was a life-long parishioner and long-time sacristan. He was also my friend. It was Tom who donated the first bench (the black one) to our prayer garden before he died. Jake and his fellow Scouts have also tidied up the area around the Guardian Angel statue near the convent and cleaned the statue itself. They also worked to clean up our two grotto areas. The Marian Grotto facing the church has been cleaned and some of the aging figurines at its base have been retired. The other grotto (closer to the Parish Center) has also been tidied up. I must admit that I am at a loss as to the name of the saint whose statue is there. Or is this simply another statue of Mary? I think that Tom would know, but unfortunately I can't ask him directly. Maybe I'll have to consult him soon at his prayer garden. In the meantime, I'm grateful to Jake, all of his fellow Scouts of Troop 512, as well as

their parents for their time, effort, and service to the Holy Cross Parish community. Thank you! I hope all enjoy now more than ever our Garden and Grottos!



For a bolder witness to the truth of the Gospel.






