FROM THE PASTOR

Today is our parish Summer Family Fun Day! Please stop by the school yard between 12:00 and 3:00 to socialize with other parishioners and enjoy the festivities. A word of gratitude to all those who worked to make this event possible, and to all those who helped with donations to pay for everything.

After today, our parish choir starts their Summer Break. We are so blessed to have so many talented singers share their vocal talents with us, and we are especially blessed to have our Director of Music, Grete Ingalls, guiding and coaching them as they enhance our liturgical worship. I receive many compliments throughout the year from visitors to the parish about the quality of the music here. I'm also amazed at the large variety and selection of hymns that our music ministry is able to handle. It's nice not to hear the same handful of hymns over and over again week after week.

Speaking of music, we're going to try something a little different for the Summer in regards to music at Mass. After this weekend through Labor Day, the 4:30 Anticipated Mass on Saturdays will be a "quiet" Mass – which is to say the Masses will be celebrated without music and singing. There will still be a cantor and organist at the Masses celebrated on Sunday—barring something unexpected.

Why are we doing this? Well, there are a couple of reasons. There's the matter of availability: we only have a handful of cantors, and with vacations and other commitments, scheduling someone for every Mass gets to be a challenge. There's a sense of the preferences of the congregation: of the three Sunday Masses, the Anticipated Mass on Saturday evening tends to be the one with the smallest congregation, and it's the one where the congregation participates the least in the music and singing. If we're going to have a simpler celebration of Mass, that one seems like the more logical choice.

Lastly, I want to try something different from the usual. It's not uncommon for parishes have one Sunday Mass celebrated without music and singing. In the parishes where there is a quiet Mass, it's almost always the earliest Mass on Sunday morning. There are good reasons for that, but sometimes we have to challenge the "it's always been done that way" argument. Having a simpler celebration of Mass on Saturday evening would be something that distinguishes us from other parishes. It might even be attractive for people in the area who aren't looking for music and singing but also aren't looking to be out of the house in time for a 7am guiet Mass somewhere.

We won't know unless we try. We'll see what happens and what feedback we receive.


