FROM THE PASTOR

Well, that was a first. Last weekend was the first time in nine years as a priest that I was too sick to be able to say Sunday Mass. A rather nasty upper respiratory infection hit me suddenly in the wee hours of Saturday morning, and by dawn I realized I was not going to be able to function for a day or two. I am very grateful to Fathers Raymundo, Whittingham, and Taglianetti for quickly responding to my text message asking for help to cover Masses on Saturday evening and Sunday, and to Deacon Tom who rearranged a family event so he could take the baptisms that I was scheduled to have here. Fortunately, nothing had to be cancelled because of their generosity.

The experience of last weekend brings up something I wrote about a couple weeks ago regarding the shortage of priests. As the number of priests goes down, it's a growing challenge to keep things covered at the parish when the parish priest is unavailable. In my experience, priests tend to be very good about helping each other out when necessary. We were ordained to celebrate the sacraments, and we don't want to deprive the people of access to them if we can help it. But there are limits to what we can do. We're not super-human. We can't be in two places at once. We get sick. We need time off to recharge or take care of personal business.

So what do we do? Well, as I wrote a couple weeks ago, we're all going to have to brace ourselves for change—and be willing to accept it when the time comes. To give one hypothetical example, I do think we have to look at Mass and Confession schedules diocese-wide. If we have an 11:00 and a neighbor has an 11:30, the priests can't help each other out if needed. But what if we had a 10:30 and they had a 12:00, or vice-versa? What if one of us would adjust our early Mass to 7am, so that those whose kids have baseball practice at 9 can still get to Mass? The earlier and later Masses disappear as parishes constrict their schedules. I bet there are over 100 churches in the diocese where Confessions are heard sometime between 3 and 5 on Saturday. But what about the other six days of the week or the other 22 hours on Saturday? Changing things around would benefit the faithful with more access, even if a little further away, and make it easier for priests to help each other on occasion. But many people (including priests!) get very attached to "their" schedule, and tinkering with the parish schedule is a good way to get a lot of hate mail.

Just to be clear, I don't foresee any changes of that sort happening here any time soon. But it's a conversation that may need to be had, and I say this as just another reminder that the way things used to be done is not how they can be done anymore. We're in unchartered territory here and adapting as we go. Keep praying for and encouraging vocations to the priesthood. And know that I and my brother priests will continue to care for your spiritual and sacramental needs as best as we possibly and humanly can.

P.S. Happy Father's Day to all the dads out there!




