FROM THE PASTOR

It's hard to believe that I'm at the two-year point in my tenure as the pastor of Holy Cross. It has been an eventful and quick-moving two years. As a parish, we've accomplished a lot in the past two years, and we've laid the groundwork for even more. The craft fair has returned, an annual Beef and Beer is on the calendar, and our Summer Family Fun Day from a few weeks ago looks like something we'll want to keep going each year. We completed the Disciple Maker Index survey and have begun a process of pastoral planning and renewal through the Next Generation Parish initiative. We purchased access to Formed and increased the number of Bible Studies and Faith Formation series being offered (with more people coming to these programs). We had the façade of the church power-washed, replaced a boiler in the church, began to add upgrades to the church HVAC to better control the temperature (and save on our utility bills), replaced a bunch of broken lights around the parking lot, fixed the one step leading to the side door of the church to make it easier to climb, and patched a bunch of leaks in any number of roofs on this campus. We began some strategic planning for the school and put the brakes on years of 5-and6figure school operating deficits. A group of dynamic, faith-filled young ladies is now living in the convent, which is providing manifold graces to our parish. I've noticed a small uptick in younger people and families at Mass on Sundays and on weekdays. Finally, the social outreach through the food pantry and St. Vincent DePaul Society is beyond amazing.

All that being said, we still have many challenges to face: pastoral, financial, and operational. A couple weeks ago, a parishioner commented on the financial snapshot in the bulletin, which shows how low our collection is compared to what we actually need, and asked if it keeps me up at night. Short answer: yes. Longer answer: I trust in God. I am confident that the Lord will send us the people and resources we need to accomplish what He has set us to do. With His help, and your cooperation, we will do just that. Thank you, dear parishioners, for all you do to for this parish. There would not be a Holy Cross without you.

Speaking of thanks, a few parishioners have thanked me for putting something in the bulletin a few weeks ago about our comportment in the church before and after Mass. It does seem like the noise level has come down a bit, leading to a more prayerful reverence in the church. Thank you to all of you for maintaining that sense of respectful quiet in the house of God.

Finally, a favor: please avoid propping open the doors to the church building before and after Mass. The reason for this is two-fold. One, we don't want to lose all the cooled air in the church to the outside. Two, there are many families of birds nesting behind the downspouts in our church walls. A couple weeks ago we had an errant balloon flying around inside the church. I think we'd all agree a bird would be much worse. So let's try to avoid that by keeping those doors closed.




