FROM THE PASTOR

Last Sunday, I used most of the space in this column to discuss the US Bishops' Three-Year Eucharistic Revival and offered some statistics about Mass attendance in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and Holy Cross Parish. Quick review: in 2017, 19% of Catholics in the Archdiocese attended Sunday Mass regularly. In 2021, it was 12.5%. For us at Holy Cross, those numbers are 11% for 2017, and 6% for 2021. Only 6% of our parishioners are here on Sunday for the most important thing we do as Catholics.


So what do we do about that? Well, for starters, that's why I jumped at the opportunity for us to participate in the Next Generation Parish. This gives us an opportunity to look at parish life and find ways to increase that number. Of course, we also have to be reasonable in our expectations. There is no magic bullet, no program or activity that will suddenly move that needle up from 6% to 60%. It's going to take a lot of work, and it's going to involve everyone making an effort.

One area where we can all make an intentional effort concerns our own demeanor in the sacred spaces of the church building. The church is a sacred space, where we have the opportunity to encounter God through our own private prayer and especially through the celebration of the sacraments. For that encounter to happen effectively, we need to be free from the distractions of the world and enter into a place of quiet. We also need to be respectful of those who are looking for that place of quiet encounter and avoid being a distraction to them.

A few parishioners have commented to me about the level of noise in the church before and immediately after Mass—not just on Sundays, but also on weekdays. ("Commented" seems like a nicer way of saying "expressed their frustration" or "complained.") The feedback from those who have said something is that there is a lot of idle conversation happening in the church that probably could and should take place elsewhere. It gets to be distracting for those who want some quiet time with the Lord. I have to agree. I've seen where people are kneeling in quiet, private prayer and a few feet away is a small group of people chatting and laughing and having a conversation that should be moved outside. So, I'll use this space to ask everyone to please maintain a spirit of reverent quiet when in the church building out of respect for the Lord and for one another.

This Sunday is our **Parish Family Fun Day**. I hope everyone will come out after the 11:00 Mass for some free food and fun.

This week is the last week of school for our Holy Cross School students. Our 8th graders will graduate on Wednesday evening. Our Pre-Kindergarten concluded last week, and Kindergarten has their closing ceremonies on Monday. Suddenly, Summer is here!


